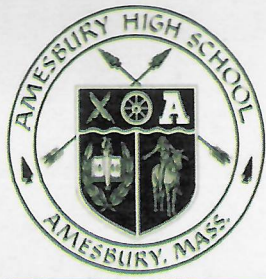

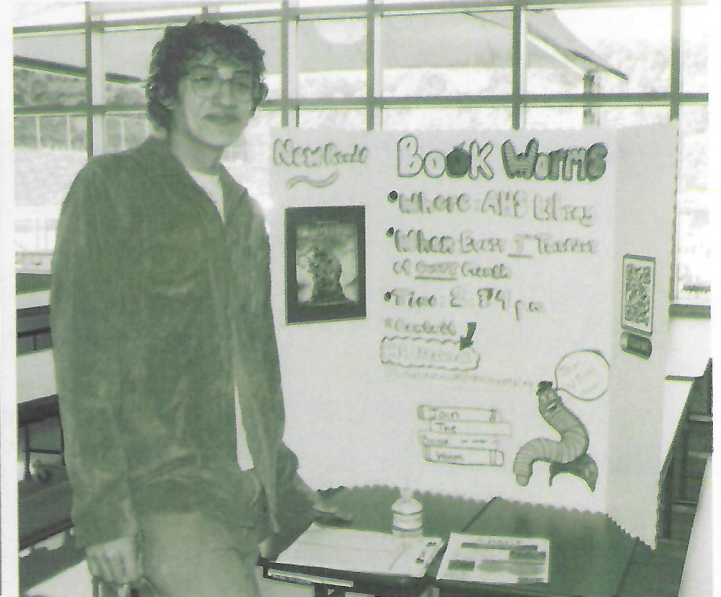
board contest among organizations. A group which has a bulletin board or wants one must post such information as what the group does and when it meets.

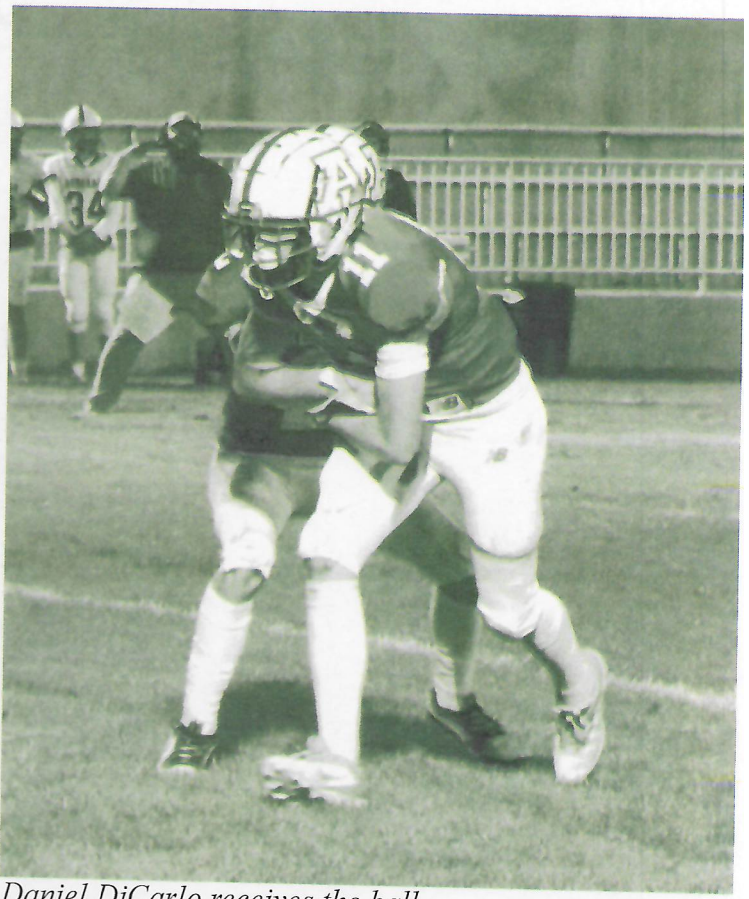

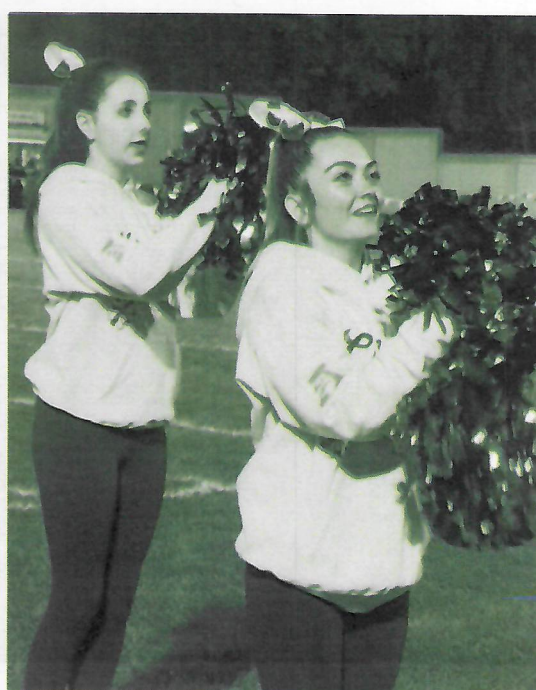

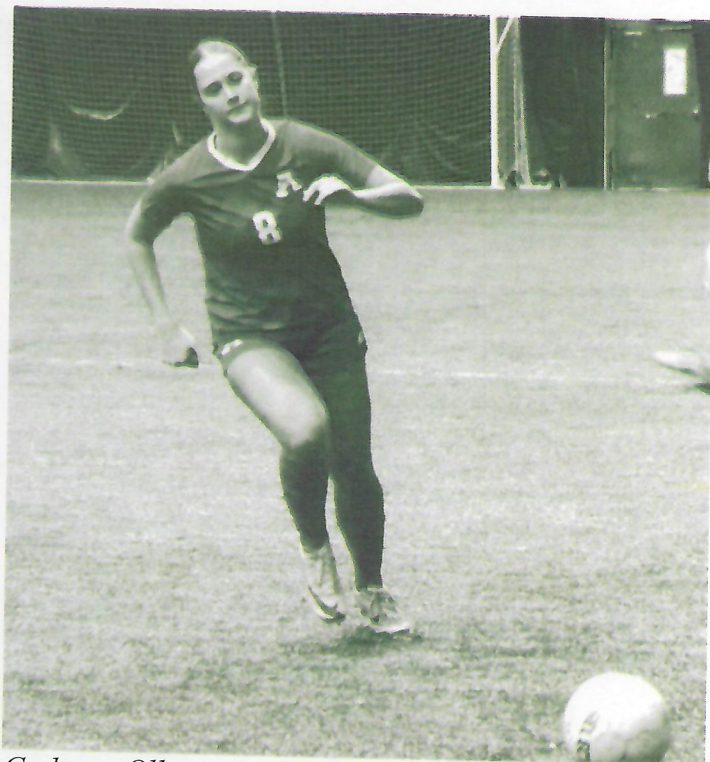

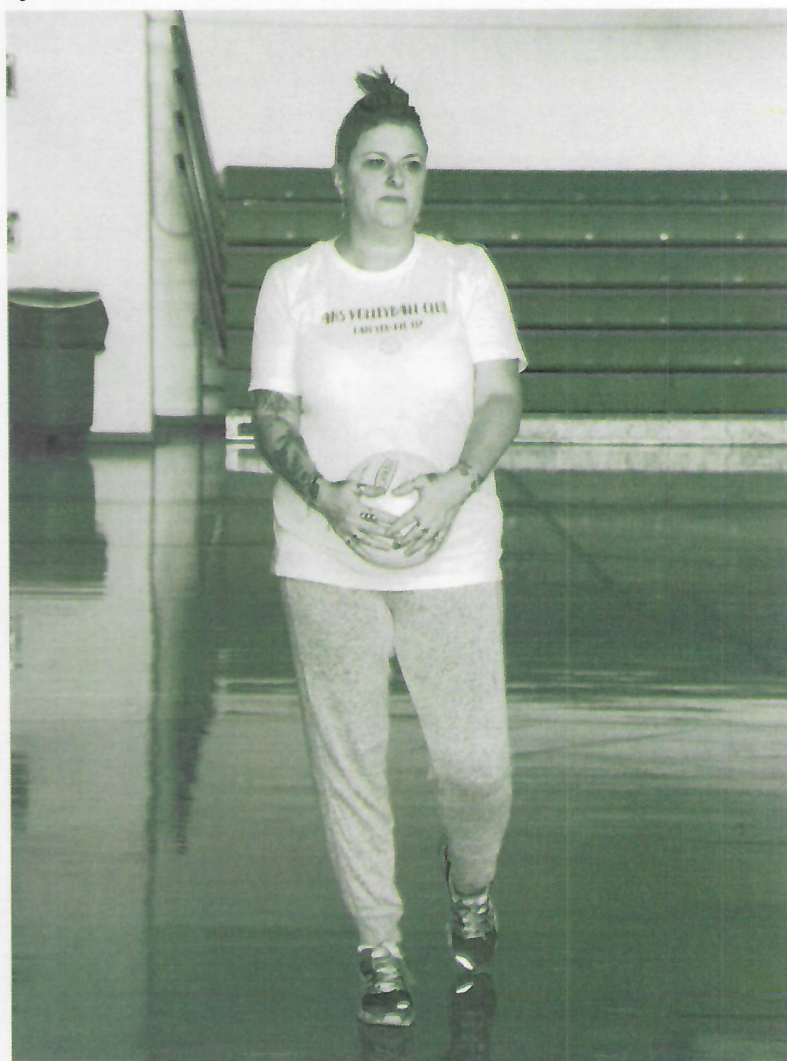

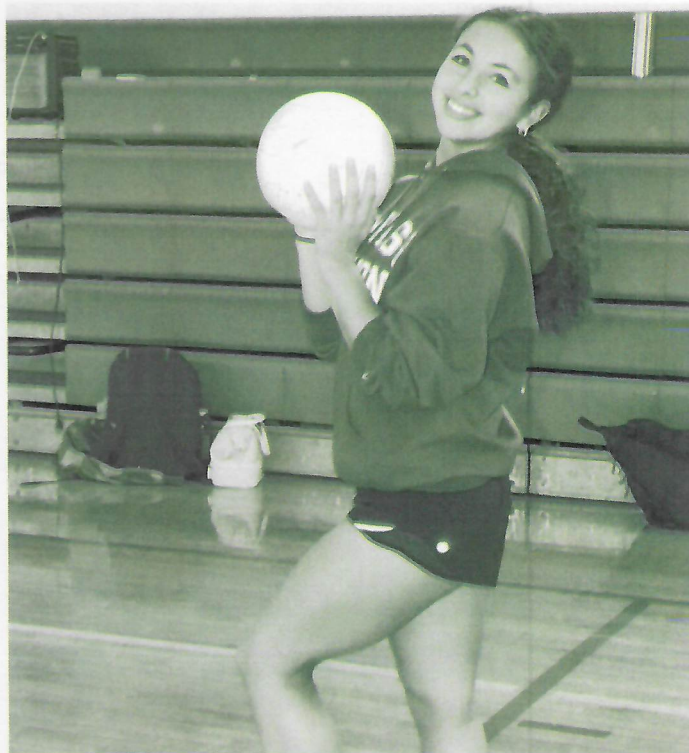

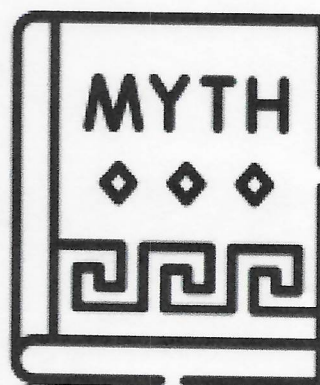
MYTHOLOGY IN MEDIA

CATS IN EGYPTIAN MYTHOLOGY

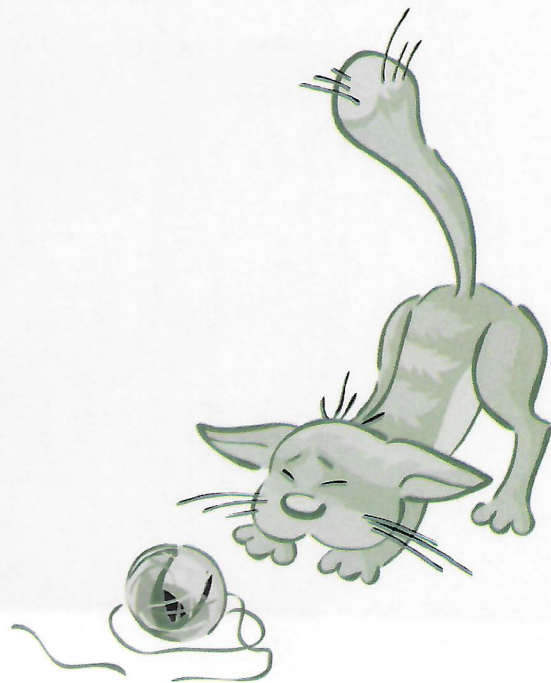
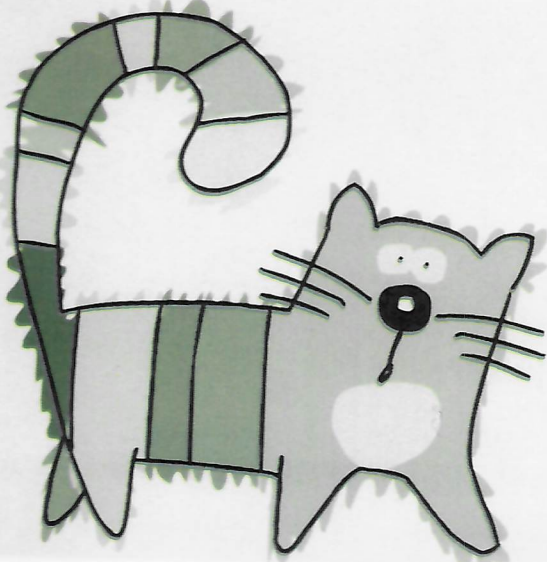

In Egyptian Mythology, cats were seen as a symbol of divinity and protection. It is commonly believed that Ancient Egyptians worshipped cats as a general animal, but that is false. Ancient Egyptians saw cats as representations of gods and divine spirits. They seemed like they were important in the afterlife as well, based on discoveries of mummified cats in coffins alongside humans.

These cats served as great companions and a means for pest control. Humans and cats in Egypt had a mutually beneficial relationship. Cats would use the houses Egyptians built as shelter when it got too hot outside, and in turn the cats would get rid of scorpions and snakes— many of which were poisonous and venomous. The Egyptians soon learned how to domesticate these animals, and they were featured in cave paintings sitting with humans or chasing birds and playing. These works of art were also featured in tombs, expressing the appreciation that Egyptians felt for these animals, so much so they wanted to spend time with them in the afterlife. A cat's presence in tombs were not limited to paintings on the wall, sometimes cats were mummified and placed in coffins with their owners.

Cats, although pampered in current society, were viewed as another version of royalty in ancient times. Kings, Pharaohs, and people of higher status would own bigger cats and dress them up in outfits and jewelry, which they would have personalized and made out of gold and jewels. They would even let their cats eat food off of their plates! People in the lower class were not wealthy enough to get jewel-embossed clothing for their cats, but would include the animal on their own clothing.

These traditions and actions by the ancient Egyptians carried on to current society, where cats are seen as one of the best animal companions a person could have. Some people spend thousands of dollars on supplies and toys for their cats, or just on the cat itself! Sphinx cats, one of the most popular cats depicted in Egyptian mythology, can cost an average of two thousand dollars. Next time you see a cat, whether it is yours or someone else's cat, just remember how important they have been for thousands of years.
