



Joe Puleo won the 300 and picked up a third in the 55 meter dash. Other firsts for Amesbury were earned by Noah Blouin (600 meters), Connor Scialdone (high jump) and Lucas Ferreira (shot put). Blouin was third in the long jump. Ty Giangregorio picked up a pair of thirds in the 1000 meters and mile.












Girls Basketball




