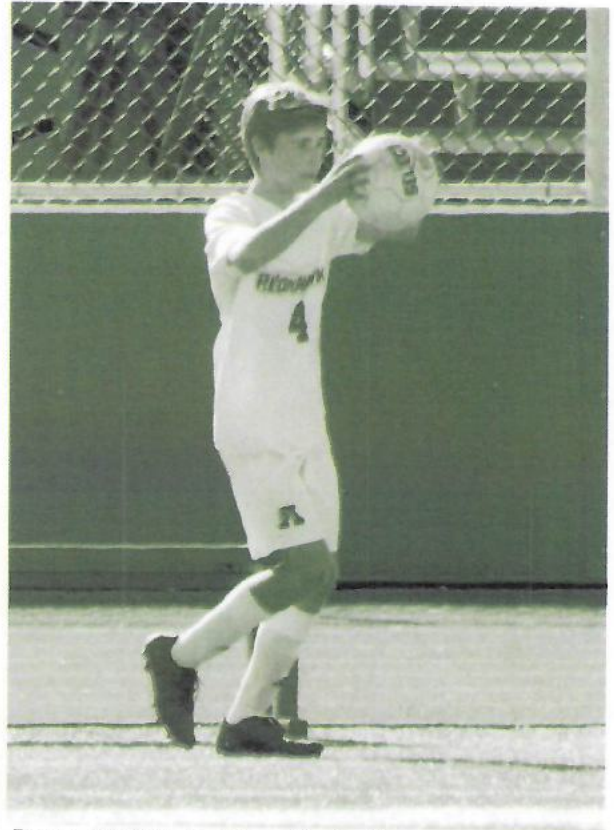
Boys' Soccer

When an undefeated team meets a 3-2 team, the outcome seems likely. It wasn't. For the fourth time in a row, Amesbury football beat a strong North Reading team last Friday in the usually-close 20-16 match up.

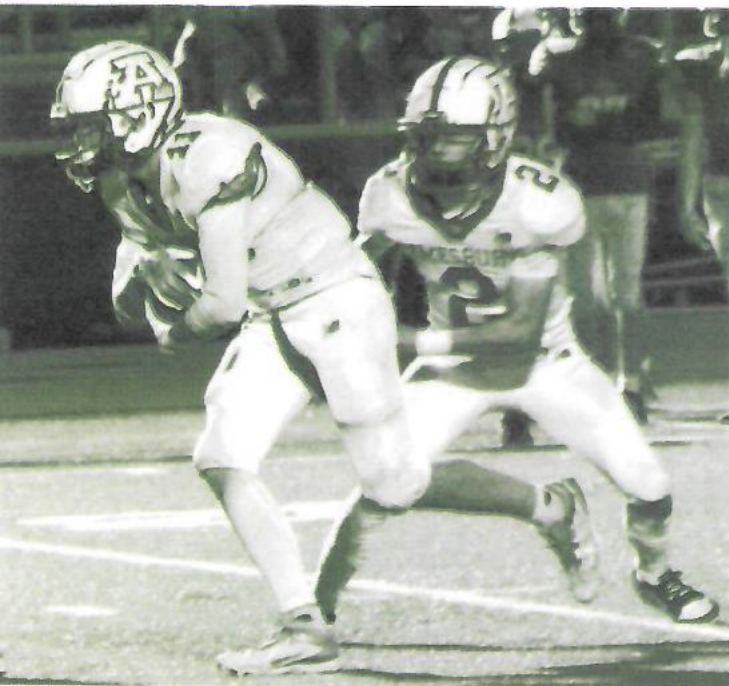
It seems like every week the Redhawks come up with a new star or technique. This week it was passes. Amesbury is a running team, but quarterback Justin Dube may just be changing that. Dube completed 5 out of 6 pass attempts for a total of 116 yards. Almost half of those were to Ethan Kirby. DJ DiCarlo had the most offensive yards, 81 on the ground and 33 in the air.

Amesbury jumped out to a 6-0 lead in the first period on a 13 yard run by DiCarlo, but North Reading came back at the end of the quarter and went ahead by kicking the extra point. Joe Puleo scored in the second period and shut down North Reading on the ground and in the air. The Hornets, however, sent in a field goal kicker, and at the half, it was 12-10 Amesbury.

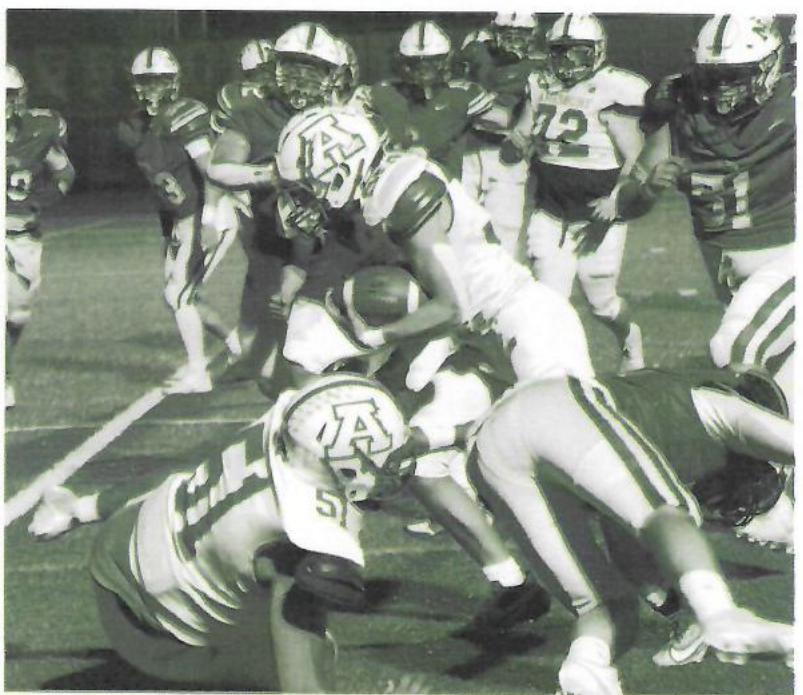
Kirby took a pass from Dube for a score in the third to make it 20-10, but the Hornets were not over yet. They scored in the fourth period and could have brought the game to a three point margin. The PAT failed, however, and Amesbury's four point lead held for the rest of the game.

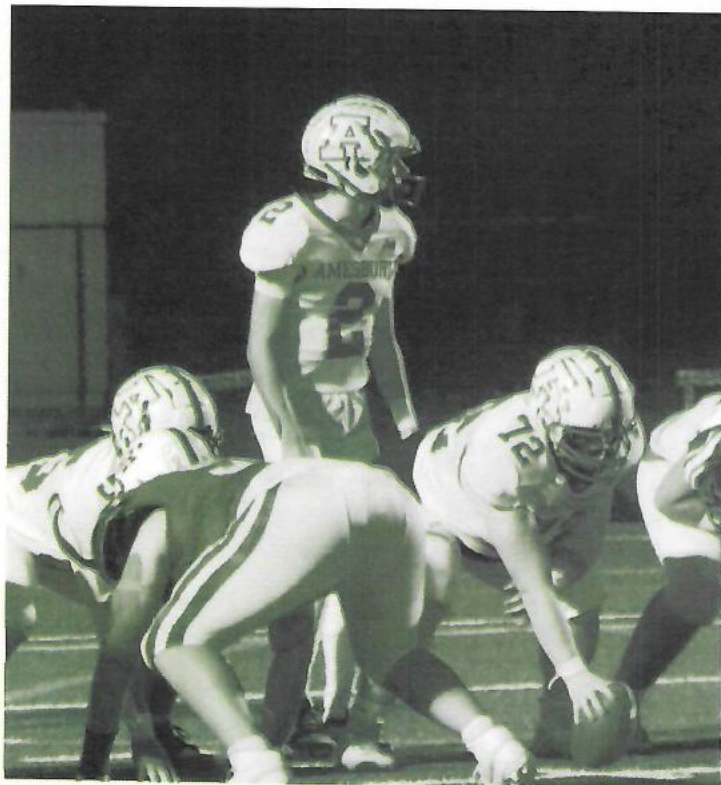

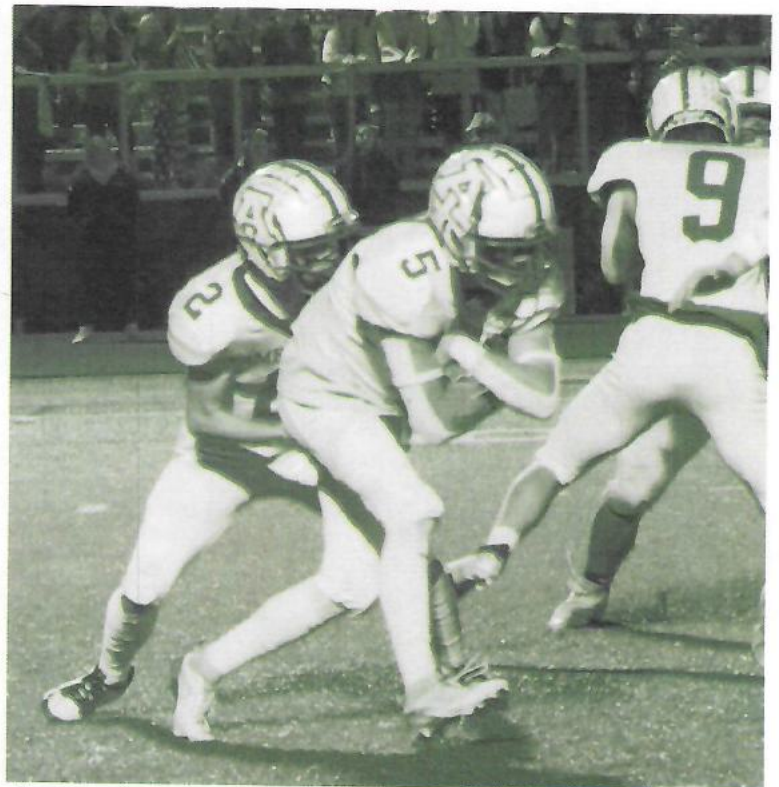

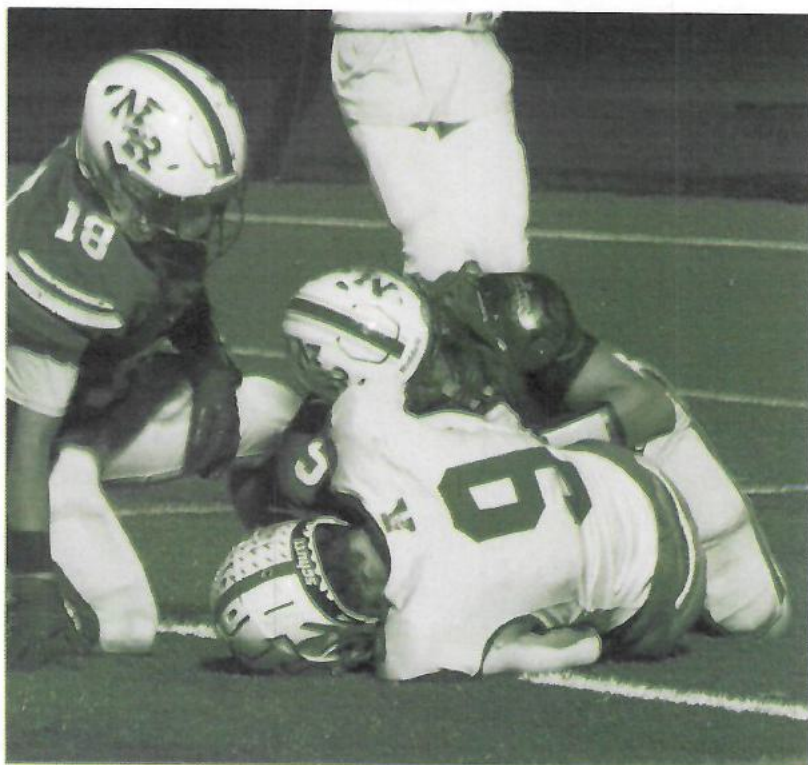
