

TRAINING IN PROGRESS!

MVP

MVP stands for Mentors in Violence Prevention. Ms. Rivers and Mr. Opolski are our school's MVP coordinators. MVP teaches students how to recognize and address teen dating violence so that they can nelp other students who may be n abusive relationships. The goal of this group is to raise awareness, change accepted behaviors and stop teen dating violence from occurring. This November 13th and 14th, a group of 22 students participated in in-school MVP raining. The participants ncluded Marley Metcalf, Sophia Huynh, Olivia Jusfredo, Kaia Bartosik, Delaney Sargent, Brooke Woodsom, Loey Rome, Jackson Dixey, Max Benica, Shelby Massey, dele Bailin, Tori Woodsom, sla Doyle, Norah Costagin, izzy Patch, Quinn Fortier, loah Tebou, Charlotte Costigan, Lydia Hunt, Ava uneburg, and Lyvia Busch.

Training, which went on or two days from 8AM to

2PM, in rooms 129/131, was led by members of the Jeanne Geiger Crisis Center. It consisted of a series of videos and group discussions. First, the trainees made lists of types of abuse on chart paper and discussed them. They read examples of real life abuse situations. The students learned how common dating violence is according to statistics. They watched videos on a woman leaving a toxic relationship and how bystanders can help prevent manipulations. They also did agree/disagree activities in which

students stood on one side of the room or the other according to whether they agreed or disagreed with particular statements.

At the conclusion of the second day, an additional 22 students are now eligible to join MVP and take an active role in teen dating violence prevention.



ART CONTEST WINNERS


Art Contest



Ashley Wilson took second for her photo "Autumn Sunset," which features brilliant orange sky colors over a vast array of pumpkins.










SAC EXPANDS





The United States of America hasn't been around for nearly as long as some other countries, but its history is important all the same. The history of America's rulers and presidents, however, is arguably one of the most important aspects of America as a whole. We've had many terrible presidents, but many influential ones as well. 61 years ago today marks the death of the youngest elected and arguably most influential presidents of the century; John F. Kennedy.

John F. Kennedy was born in Brookline, Massachusetts on May 29, 1917. He went to Harvard during the Great Depression and graduated in 1940. After his graduation, He enlisted in the Navy. In 1943, a Japanese destroyer boat rammed into his PT boat, and Kennedy helped lead the others to safety. He became a Congressman for the Democratic party and advanced to the Senate in 1953, and married Jaqueline Kennedy the same year. He almost gained nomination for Vice President in 1956, but in 1960, he was a first-ballot nominee for President. He became the first Roman Catholic President in 1961, narrrowly beating Richard Nixon.

His most famous quote is "Ask not what your country can do for you—ask what you can do for your country." He planned to improve conditions where privation and poverty were most prevalent. He called for new civil rights legislation and improvement regarding the reach of human rights. He persisted through the fight between Russia and Vietnam, satisfied that both sides showed interest in stopping the spread of nuclear weapons and slowing the arms race.

In 1963, during his campaign against Barry Goldwater for the next presidential election, Kennedy traveled to Texas to present a show of unity between Gov. John Connally Jr. and Sen. Ralph Yarborough. On Friday, November 22, he and his wife Jackie Kennedy were in an open limousine at 12:30 p.m. during a parade when he was shot in the head by Lee Harvey Oswald, being pronounced dead at Parkland Memorial hospital shortly after. Lyndon B. Johnson took the presidential oath at 2:38 p.m. the same day.


ART WINNERS ANNOUNCED


THANKSGIVING OOPSIES


Dear Mr Doughboy,
