





MASC Annual Conference

Last week, twelve of AHS's Student Council members travelled to Hyannis, MA for the 49th annual MASC conference. Advisors, Mrs. Johnston and Mrs. Brockmyre accompanied students Maddie Clark, Bailey Kimball, Tori Murphy, Liv Thorpe, Gwen Murphy, Katie Welch, Lauren Talbot, Kenzie Cameron, Liv Jusfredo, Brooke Woodsom, Isla Doyle and Lily Cark. Over the course of three days the group participated in countless activities with the many other councils in attendance.

They kicked the week off with a polar plunge on Wednesday afternoon. This was a fundraiser in support of the Special Olympics of Massachusetts, which has had a partnership with MASC for many years now. On Wednesday and Thursday students also listened to presentations from two keynote speakers, Eddie Slowikowski and Brandon Lee White. Aside from this, most of the council members' time was taken up by workshops designed to strengthen leadership and communication skills. Workshops were run by MASC delegates, keynote speakers, and representatives from Special Olympics Massachusetts. Activities varied from dance exercises, team-building activities, student council related

discussions and goal management. The purpose of these workshops was to not only bring the schools closer together, but to also provide students with new skills and resources that they can bring home to their own student councils.

One of the main discussion points of the week was the elections of the new MASC Executive Board members for the year of 2026-2027. On Thursday morning, students gathered together to listen to speeches from all candidates. This year there were four candidates for the position of secretary, six for vice president, as well as six for president. Because of the large number of candidates, there ended up being a run off for the positions of secretary and president. On Thursday night, the individuals voted once again, leading to the final decisions. On Friday morning, just before the councils all hit the road to go home there was a presentation of awards that concluded with the new MASC Executive Board Members. This year, the AHS Student Council was honored with a gold council of excellence award, which is the highest level. This honors exceptional student councils and their work and also opens up many opportunities for the council in the future. In the end, Layla Maloney from Silver Lake

Regional High School was elected as the new MASC secretary, Nathan Cardichon from Cardinal Spellman High School was chosen for MASC vice president and Lucy Haile from Minnechaug Regional High School was elected as MASC president for the 2026-2027 school year.

While the students put so much effort and time into their activities this past week, they also had so much fun during their free time. On Wednesday night they watched schools compete in an elaborate lip sync contest to songs from Justin Bieber, Bruno Mars and musicals like Hamilton and Grease. Students also got to go swimming in the hotel pool, participate in trivia, karaoke and much more. On Thursday night, after the annual MASC banquet, students headed on down to the MASC dance. This event is the highlight of the week for many MASC delegates. They get to celebrate their hard work and spend quality time with their friends from their council, as well as all of the new friends they have made over the past two days.




A FUN FAIR













BABY MILLER



LUCAS FERREIRA


Senior Profile


Senior Profile
