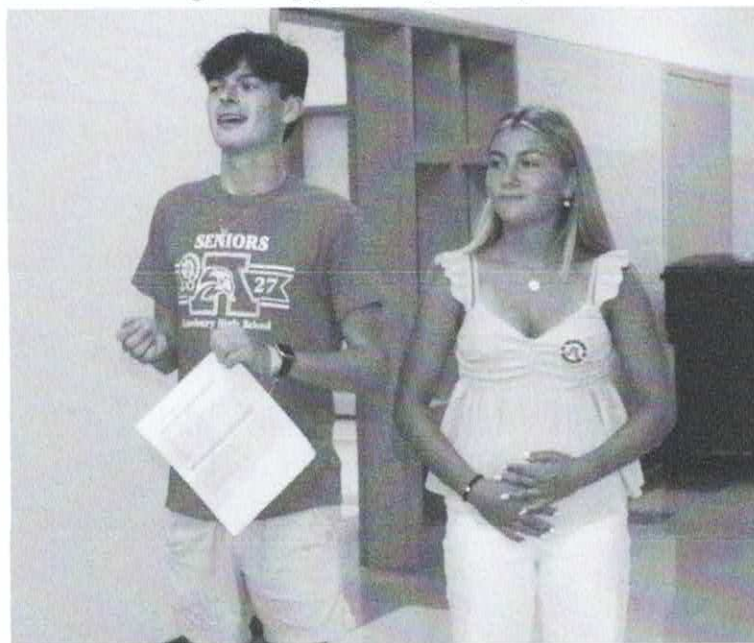
Freshman Orientation

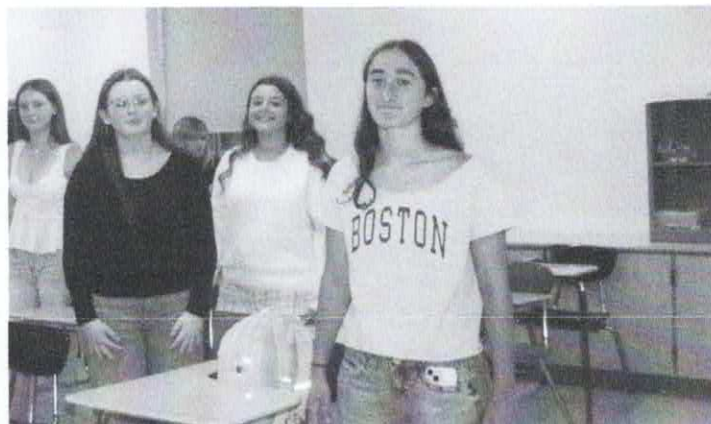

Events After Our Last Spring Issue

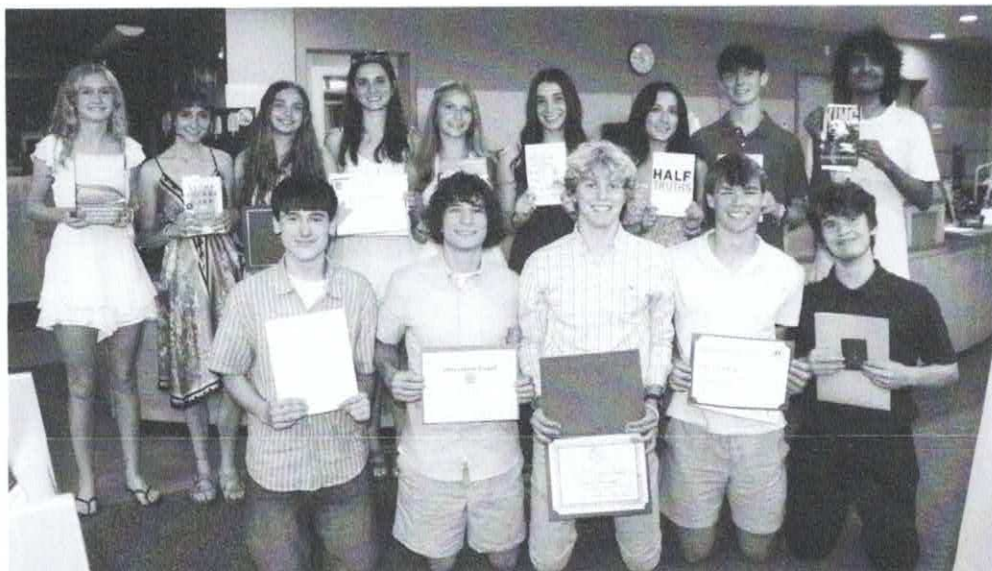

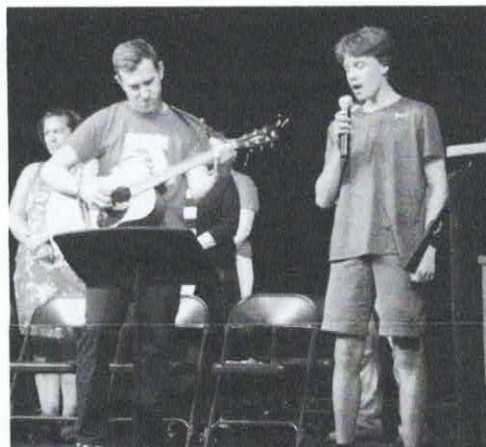

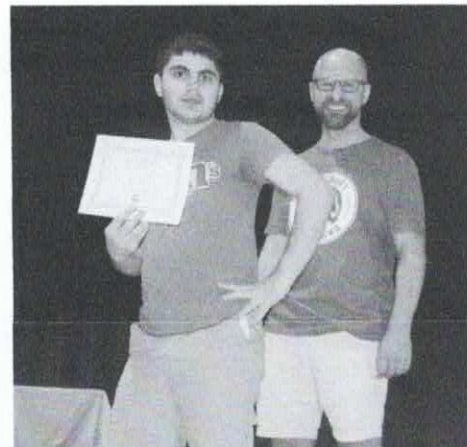

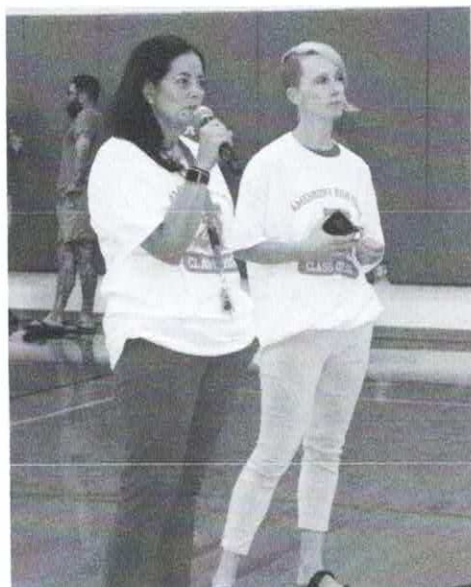
NEW AND RETURNING STAFF

Genuardo, with many more at AHS to come!

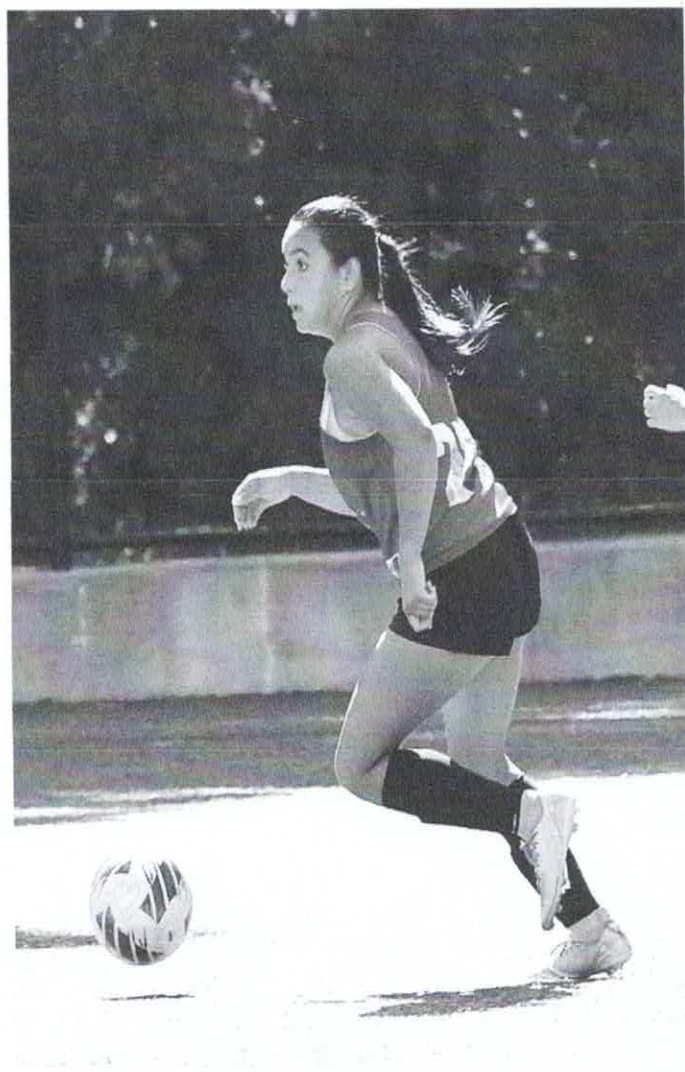


WORKING HARD

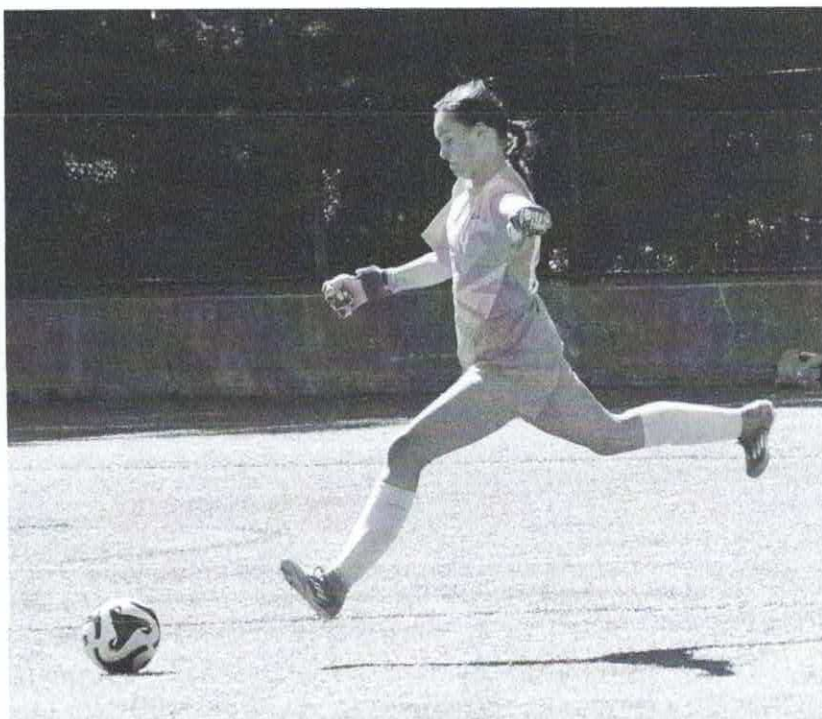

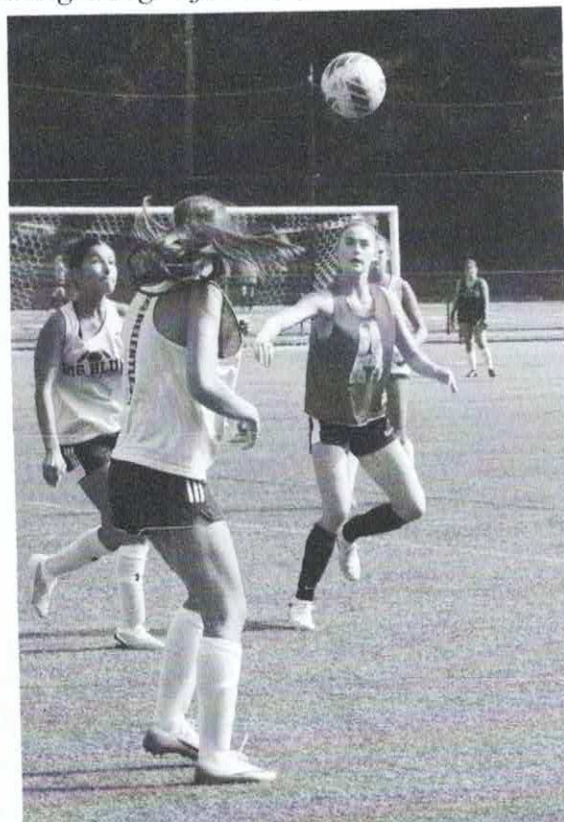

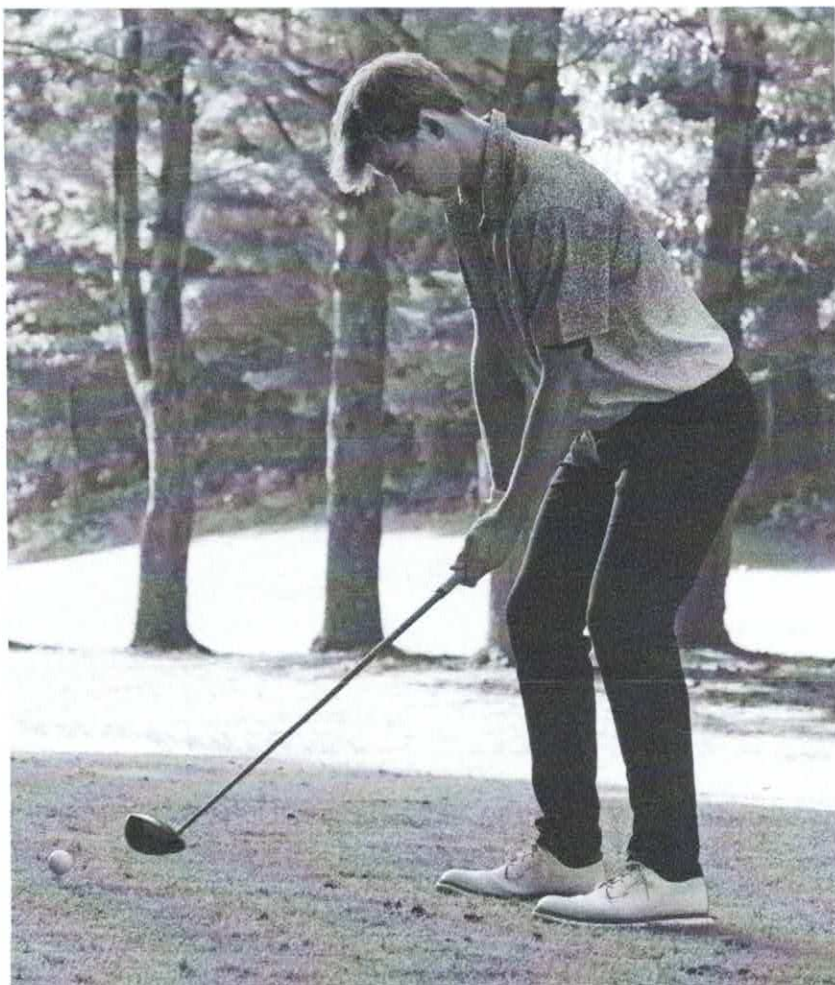
OFF TO A GREAT START

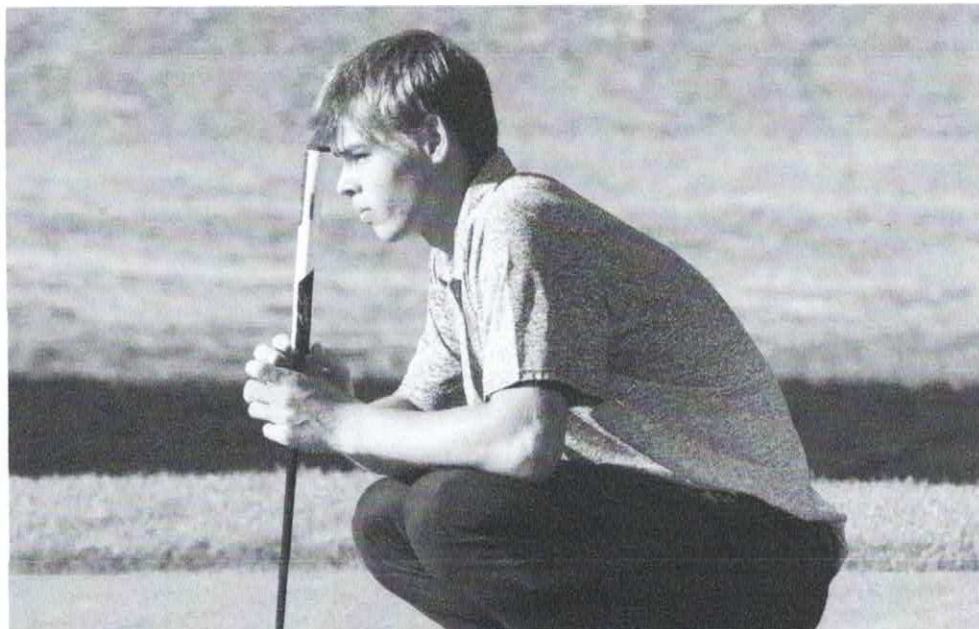

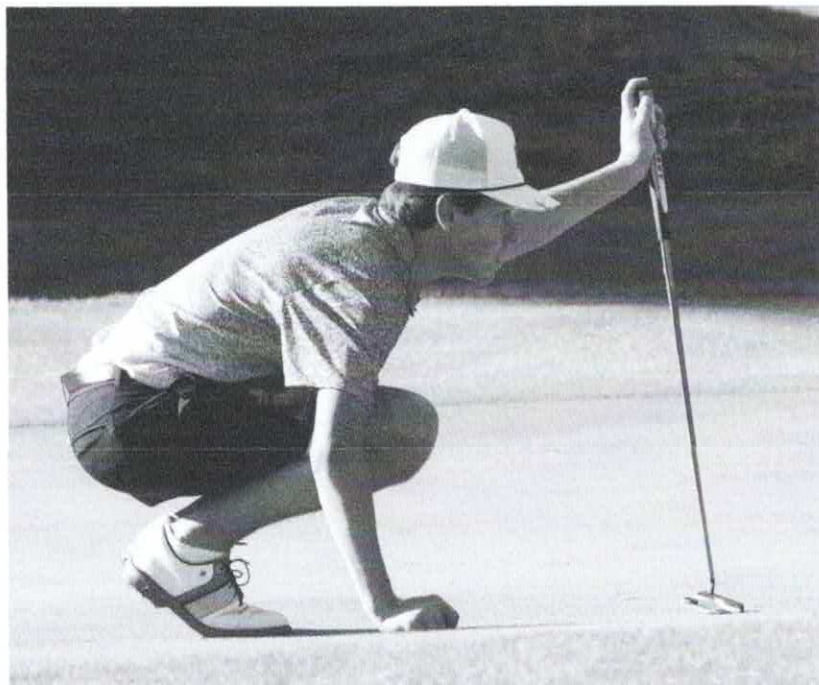

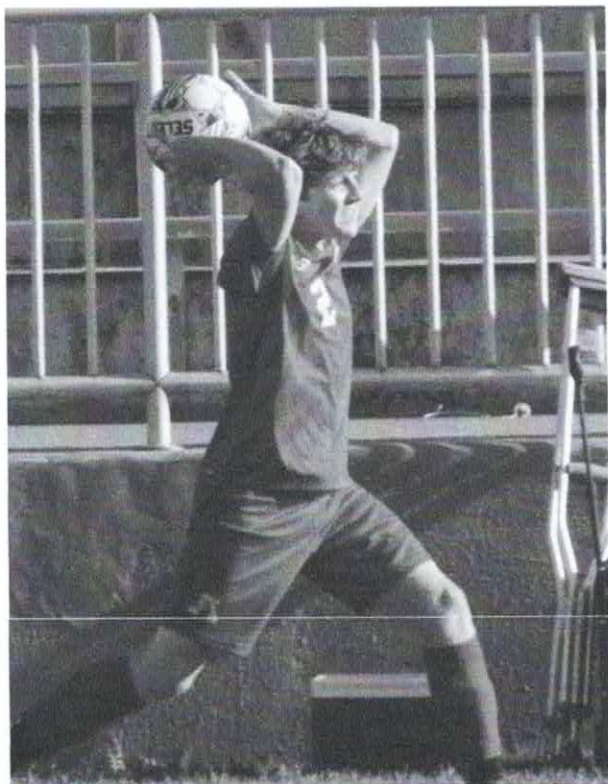

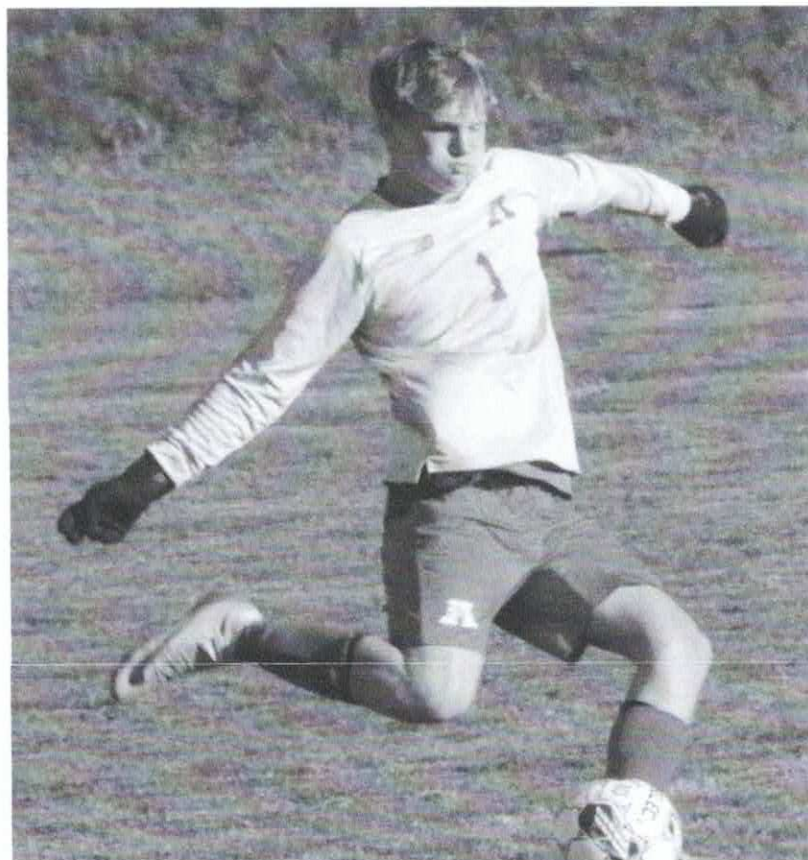

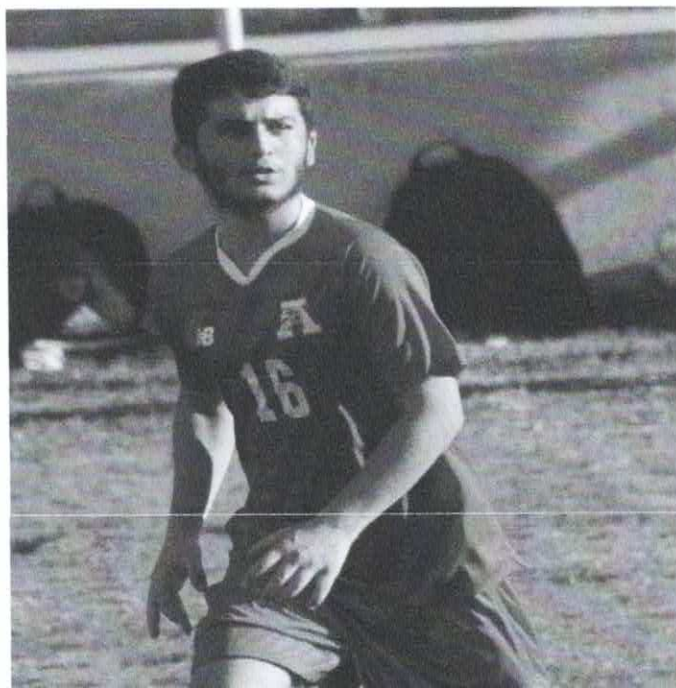
