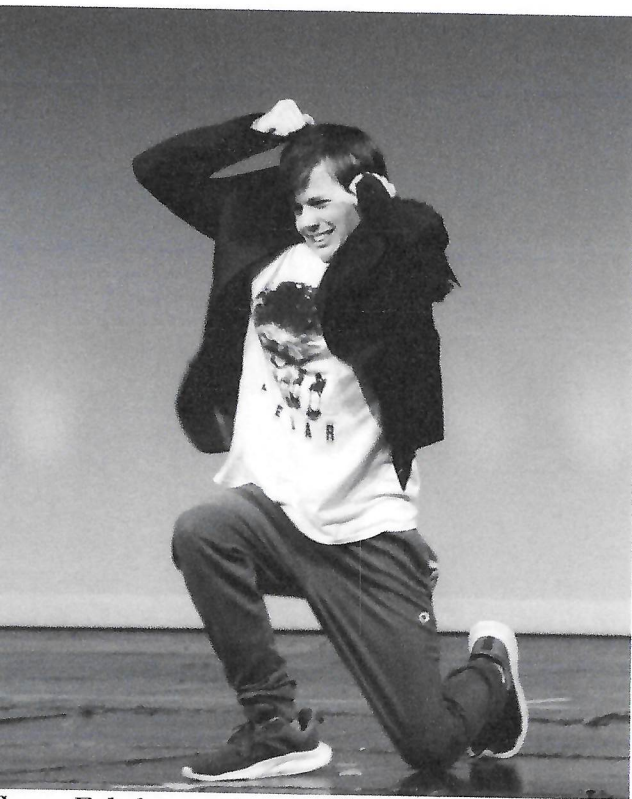

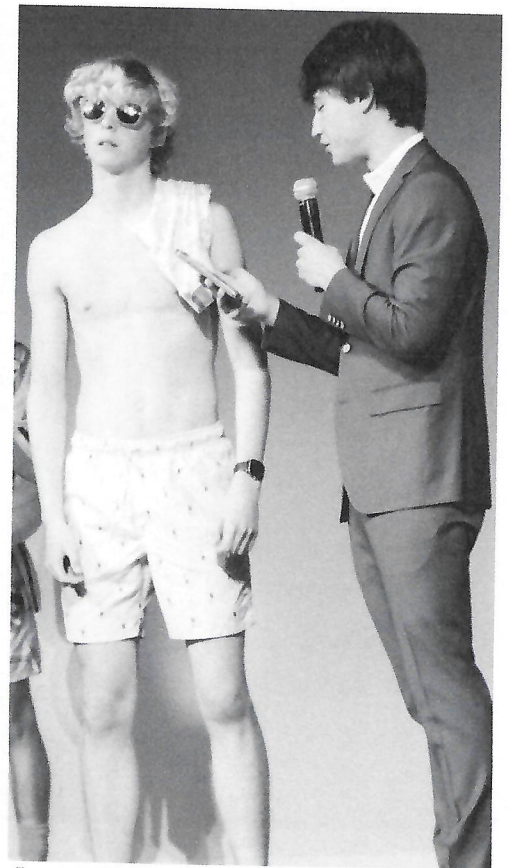

BYE BYE MCAS

If you are one of the tiny number of students at AHS who failed MCAS, then you don't have to worry about that anymore. The results on Question 2 on Tuesday's state ballot eliminated MCAS as a graduation requirement. By law the state has to have some kind of test but students won't have to pass it to graduate.

FOOTBALL PLAYOFFS

The MIAA power rankings have proved very accurate except for the Redhawks. If Amesbury is still in the playoffs after Mashpee, they will likely be playing Clinton (2nd) or Cohasset (7th) the following week, potentially the same night as the Homecoming Dance. How this all plays out remains to be seen.

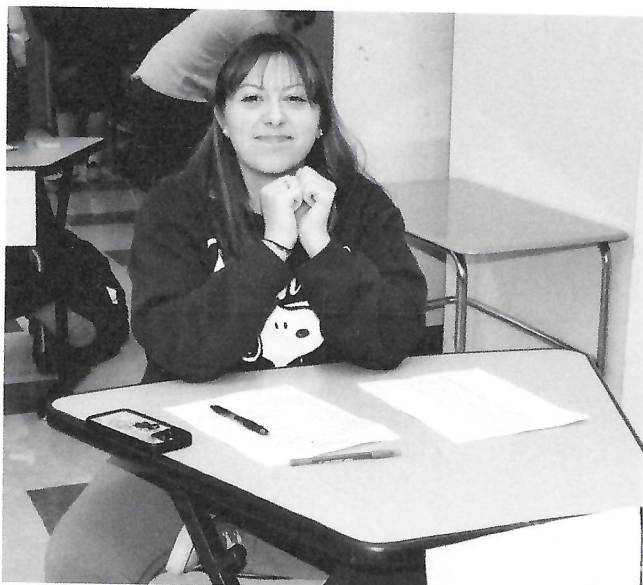
Mock Election

This past Monday, the History National Honors Society hosted a mock-election. Students had the opportunity to practice participating in their civic duty by voting in the upstairs double room during WIN. One hundred sixteen students came to vote; twenty five freshmen, twenty five sophomores, twenty six juniors, and forty seniors participated.

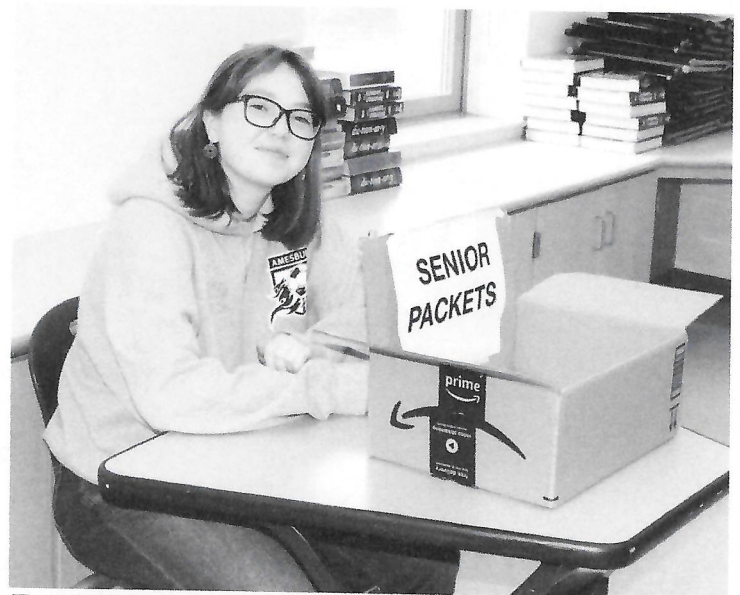
The results of AHS' election were quite a bit different than the national election. Our school's ballot included all the Presidential candidates, Senators, Representative, and all five of Massachusetts ballot questions. Vice President Kamala Harris won our election by a margin of only twenty votes, sixty two for Harris and forty two for Trump. And every third party candidate had at least one vote! Elizabeth Warren won for Senate with nearly double the votes of Republican John Deaton. Seth Moulton, running unopposed, kept a hold of his seat. Ballot questions one, two, three, and four all passed with AHS Students, with Question five being the failed proposal. In terms of ballot question four, more people voted in favor of psychedelic drugs than for either of the presidential candidates. Rho Kappa's president Aiden E. Neale would like to thank everyone who participated. This was his pet project and he was very happy to see it succeed the way it did.

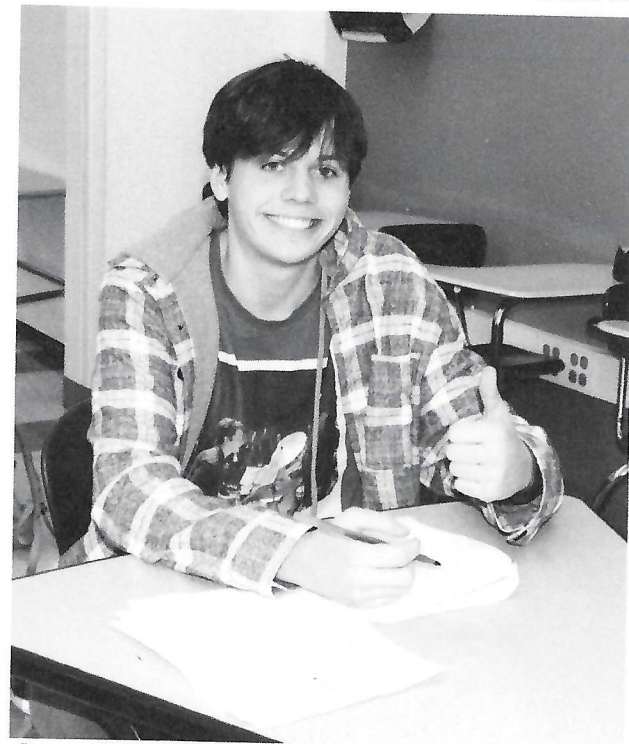

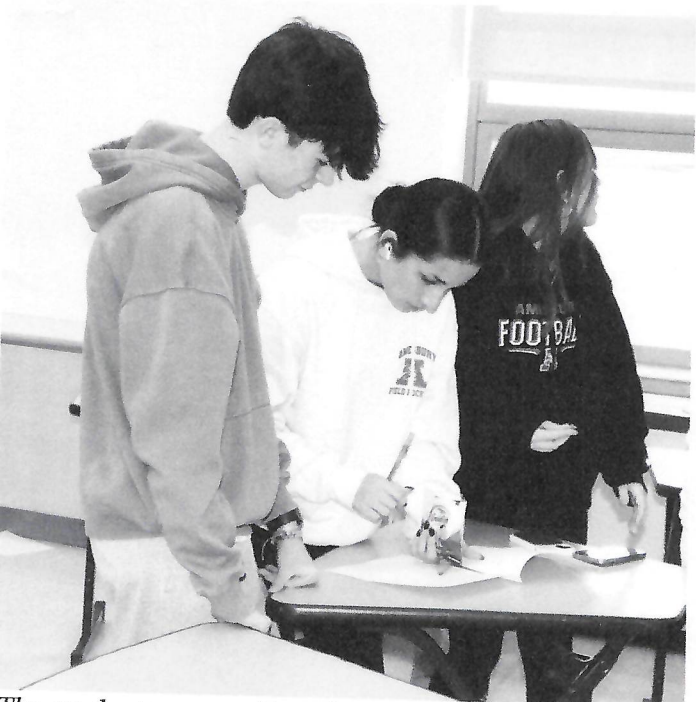

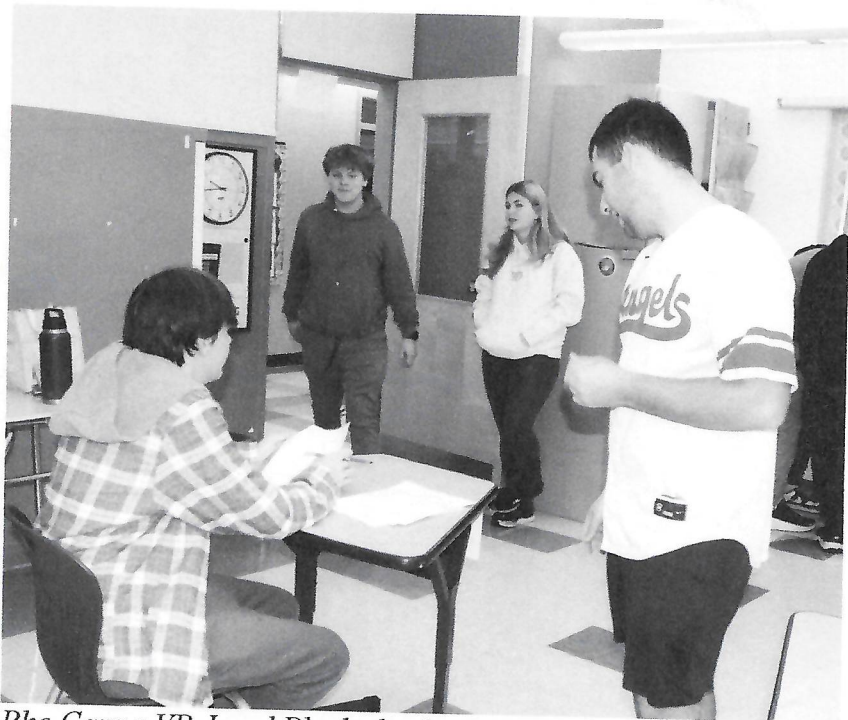

16-14 WIN FOR AMESBURY

Amesbury and Manchester Essex entered last Friday's contest at Landry about as evenly matched as you can get. Both teams were 5-2. Both had lost to the same teams. The Redhawks were ranked 6th by the MIAA while the Hornets were 8th.

Anyone entering senior night would not see Justin Dube practicing field goals. It's been ten years since Amesbury kicked a field goal. Thankfully it didn't come down to that.

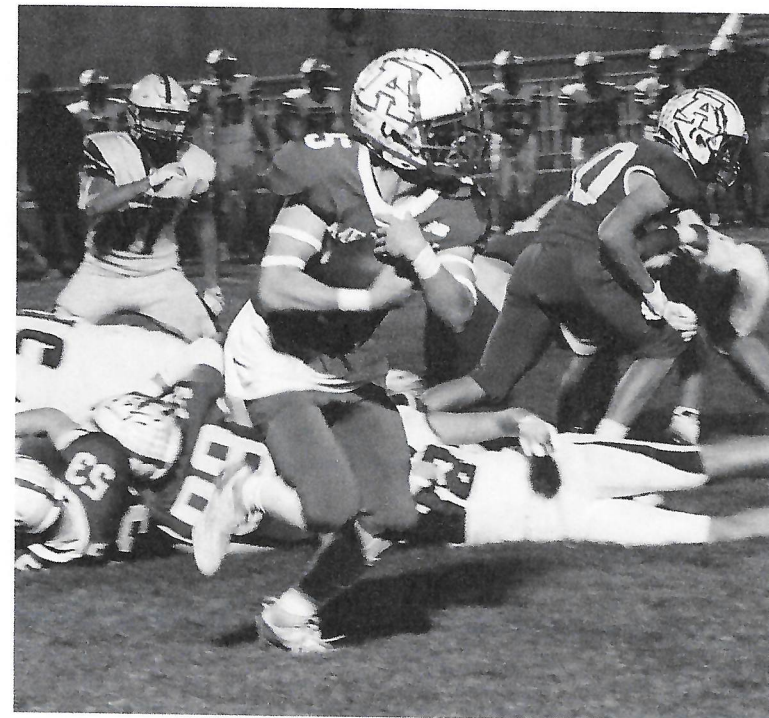
The first half was an even fight. The Hornet's defense was excellent while the Redhawks offense line left something to be desired. Quarterback Dube was sacked several times, and Amesbury had to punt three times. On the positive side, Parker DeLong may be the kicker Amesbury has been looking for as he boomed three low snaps high in the air. The first quarter was scoreless. Both teams scored, with 2 point conversions, in the second quarter. Amesbury's TD and points were scored by DJ DiCarlo. At the half it was 8-8.

Both teams scored in the third (Connor Scialdone), but Amesbury got their extra points, complements of Dube. The Redhawks were able to block the Hornets' attempt. This brought the score to 16-14, which ended up being the final, but Amesbury was on the one yard line when time ran out, so the score could have been 22-14 with an additional 15 seconds.

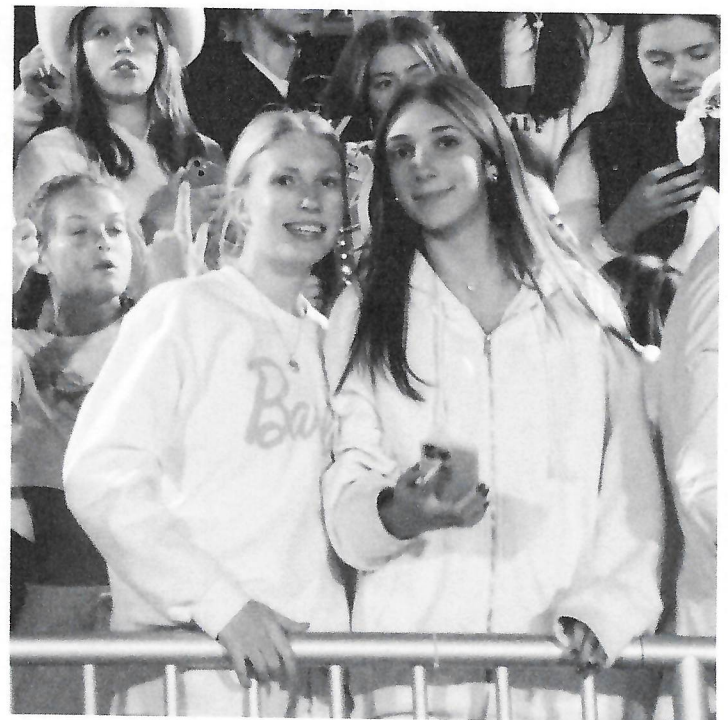

THE GENIUS OF KNIVES OUT

Knives Out is a 2019 American mystery film that some producers label as the best of its time due to its ingenious plot structure, character design, and plot. The movie begins with well-renowned millionaire who died in his own home while his whole family was in the house. We follow the famous French detective Benoit Blanc as he and his team try to solve this murder. At first, the questioning goes as expected for a typical murder mystery; each family member is brought in and questioned as Blanc trying to fether out who is telling the truth and who might be lying. However, something goes differently in this case. The elderly victim's caregiver, Marta, cannot lie; when she lies, she physically cannot stop herself from vomiting after she tells a lie. For this reason, she is not focused upon too much to be the main suspect involved with the murder. The viewer continues to follow Detective Benoit Blanc as he attempts to solve this well-hidden and intricate murder. However, about thirty minutes into the movie, the viewer watches this scene unfold in relation to the housekeeper; it turns out that Marta *did* actually kill Harlan. When she was giving him his nightly medication, she accidentally gave him 100mg of morphine, of which it was previously established that that kind of dose would kill him in ten minutes. Harlan knows that an ambulance will not come in that time, so being very fond of Marta as his caregiver and friend, he acknowledges his fate and gives her a plan to stage the night so it looks as if Harlan had taken his own life. Further knowledge is introduced after Harlan's will is read, saying he did not leave anything to his family, but instead all of his possessions are left to Marta, creating more drama within the members of the family.

We watch this process unfold, and quickly, the direction of this movie changes; we go from watching the detective try and solve this tricky murder case and rooting for him to get to the bottom of it, to the complete opposite side of a "whodunit" film; the reader is now rooting for Marta to get away with the murder, and for the detective *not* to be able to solve it and figure out who the real killer is. Within the span of ten minutes, the direction of this film pivots from its original idea to a completely opposite story within the same universe. But the genius of this film keeps on going; near the end of the film, we find out that Marta had *not*, in fact, been Harlan's real killer. It is revealed that Harlan's grandson, Ransom, had actually switched the vials of medicine of which Marta had gotten mixed up. Ransom's intention was to have Marta accidentally kill Harlan; he was angry that Harlan had cut him out of the family inheritance and wanted him dead. HOWEVER, Marta defied this plan; she actually did give Harlan the correct medication, unaware that the bottles had even been switched. She had recognized the correct chemical from its weight (doctors' intuition). When she looked at the labels afterward, she thought she had dosed Harlan wrong, which set off his whole plan of staging it to look like he took his own life. He was not going to die, because she had not actually overdosed him on morphine; in technicality, this did make his death a real suicide, even if it was due to false thoughts. This double twist is ingenious on the part of the writers; just when the viewers thought they had it all figured out from the first twist, they throw another in their direction near the end of the movie to ensure the viewer will be confused, astonished, and asking for more.
