LET'S EAT

School lunch

It's free, but do you like it? We're talking about the school lunch.

When the Student Advisory Council met with the School Committee in December, it outlined

some of its goals. One of them was improving the school lunch. In fact, most of the SAC members when questioned individually said that was their top priority. Chairperson Addi Snow said, "I heard a lot of complaints about the lunch and dealing with students complaints is the job of SAC."

What exactly lunch? They can't be

too bad since lunch participation has doubled since the lunches became free. Some feel there are fewer food options in second lunch. The cafe says that isn't true, but the perception is there. Others feel there is not enough variety or choices they want to eat. There are 16 choices every day, according to the assistant cafe manager Beverly

Brown. These include 2 or 3 kinds of pizza, several different sandwiches, at least two salads, and bento boxes, so one has to ask just what to the kids want. Since some students depend on the school lunch as a major meal, SAC was also concerned about meeting dietary requirements for those with

allergies or food preferences. They found out that the cafe will make a special lunch for anyone who can prove a health issue.

This past Monday, several members of SAC, including chairperson Addi Snow, met with Dr. Ricci, the director and assistant director of the AHS cafe, and a nutritionist. The purpose of the meeting was to finalize a survey, which was sent out Tuesday during WIN. The window to

answer was open until Thursday The purpose of the survey was t determine why students did, or di not, eat the school lunch. survey not only asked fc preferences, but made student aware of things which they ma

not have known, suc as they can get th main meal side (frie etc) regardless (what entree the choose, or that th cafeteria wi accommodate a allergies with doctors' note. Whe asked if she thoug the survey would c any good, Sno replied, "Yes, we a working efficient with the cafe sta and they are board."

SAC advisor Barbara Lea: said, "I think it's already don some good. I eat lunch in the car and I never knew I could get th main dish sides even if I got sandwich."

Hopefully students wi become more satisfied with th cafe in the future.

WHERE'S THE PIZZA?

School Lunch Cont.

Main Results of the Lunch Survey - 190 answered the survey

- 1. The number one reason students eat the school lunch is because it's free. Fifty-one percent eat the school lunch every day, and 80% eat it at least once a week. The second most-common reason for chosing the school food is because it's convenient.
- 2. When students don't eat the school food, the most common reasons given are, in order: lack of quality, don't like the taste, not filling enough, and I prefer to bring my lunch from home.
- 3. When asked to list 2 or 3 of their favorite lunches, to no surprise, the favorite lunch was pizza at 57%, followed by grilled cheese with soup (35%), Mexican (33%) Italian (32%), and breakfast for lunch (32%).
- 4. When asked about favorite sides, the top choice was NOT fries. The top choice was fresh fruit, followed by fresh vegetables and pasta salad. This may be because fries are usually served with the main meal and almost half the students did not know they could get the main meal sides even if they didn't get the main meal.
- 5. Students would prefer to see a fruit and yogurt bar added to the options. That choice beat out a deli bar and a salaci




TOUGH LOSS


