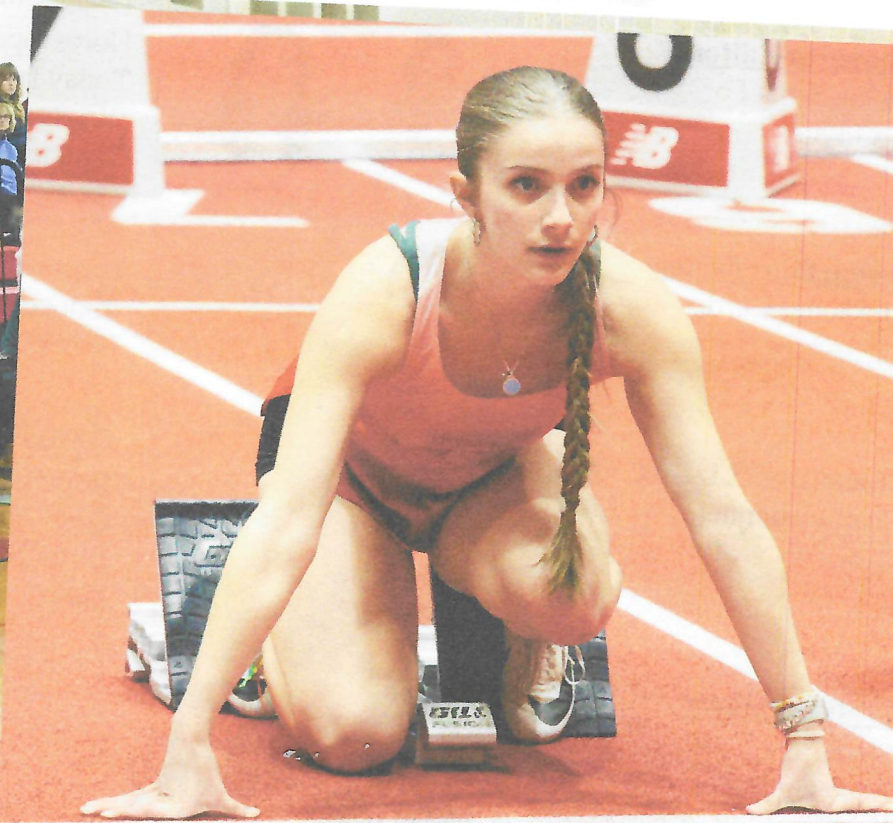

Boys' Track

The boys' indoor track team remains the only undefeated winter team at AHS. This past Tuesday, they beat Hamilton-Wenham 71-39 for their third win. None of the meets have been close. All of the meets have been at the New Balance Track in Boston.

One would think the loss of the famous Sanchez brothers, along with player of the year Aiden Donovan, would have left the team in dire straights, but the underclassmen seem to have picked up the slack. There are only two seniors on the team.

Against the Generals, Ben Wood and Joe Puleo went 1-2 in the 55 meter dash, Noah Blouin and Joe Puleo went 1-2 in the 300 meters. Maxx Rodrigues won the 600 meters. Ben Wood, DJ DiCarlo, and Connor Scaildone swept the 55 meter hurdles. Scaildone, Brody Hall, and DiCarlo swept the high jump. Lucas Ferreira, Marcus Colon, and Jack Harrington swept the shot put.

It was only in the long distance running events that Amesbury had any trouble. Josiah Fugate, who is normally far ahead of his opponents, had to settle for a second in the 1000 meters and third in the mile. In the two mile, Brody Hall was second and Fugate was third.

Next Tuesday, the RedHawks meet Lynnfield at New Balance track. The following Tuesday, they meet Essex Tech in a non-league meet also at New Balance.

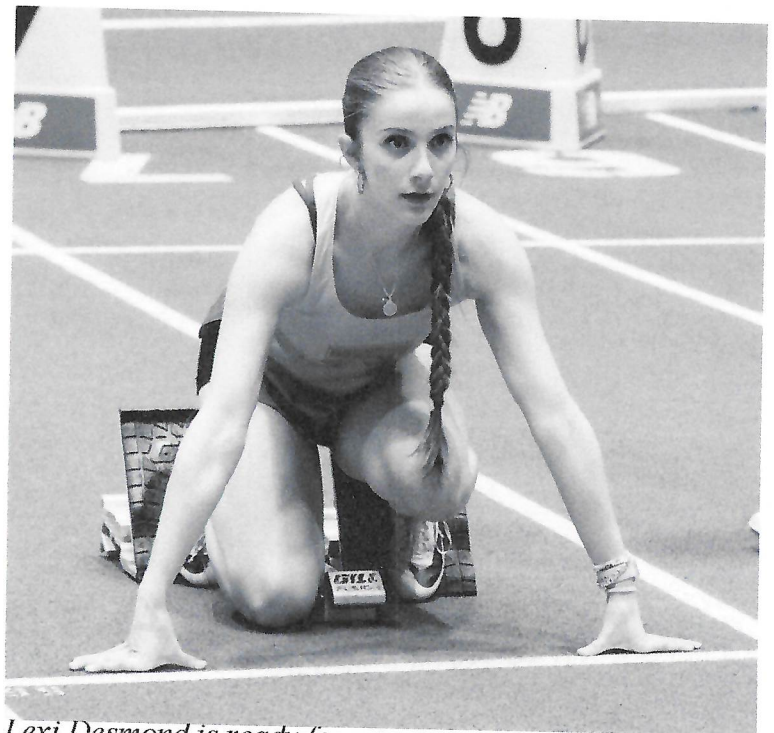

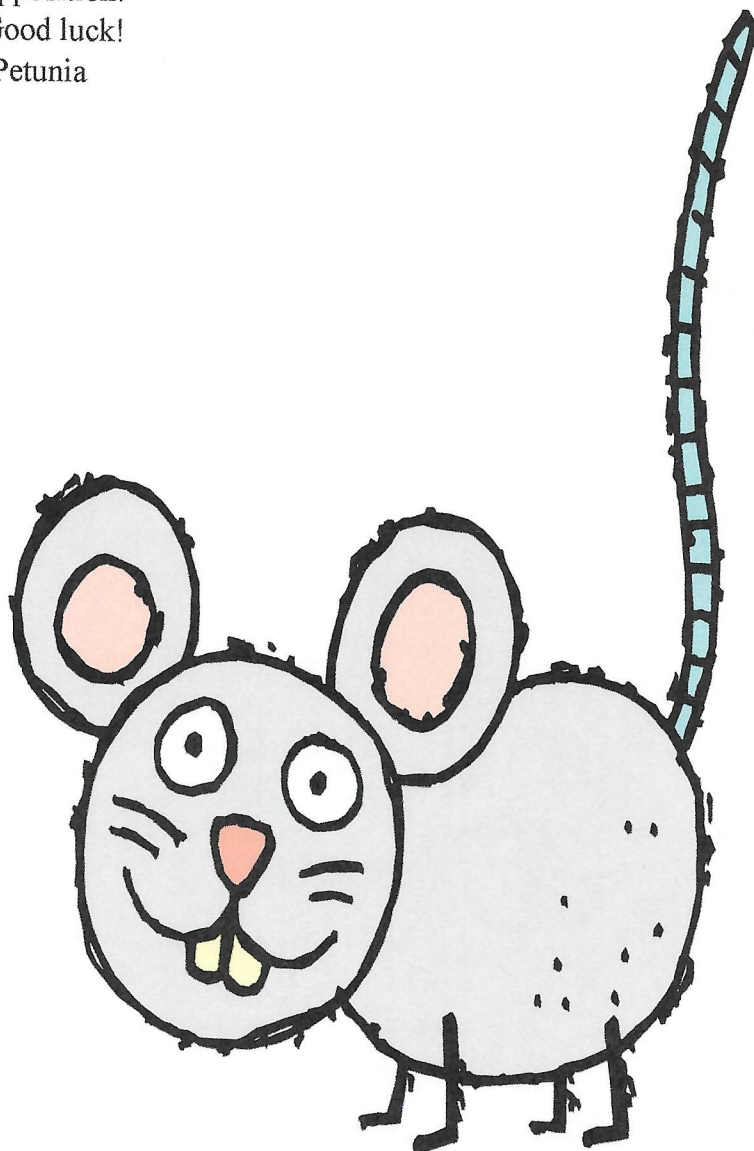
Dear sir,

Editors In Chief (3)

Proof and Style Editors (the proofreaders) (2 or 3)

Business Editors (2) - collects money and lays out ads sections

Senior Section Editors (2) - layout

Student Life Editors (all the clubs and events) (2) - layout

Faculty Editors (does the faculty section) (2) - layout

Underclass Editors (does the underclass section) (2) - layout

Sports Editors (2) - layout

Staff Coordinator (1) - designs and types the index, keeps track of how many times kids are in the yearbook

Photo Coordinator (1) - Manages the photo department, assigns jobs, organizes photo day, makes sure things get done. It helps to be a photographer but not totally necessary. This person usually does the Sing-out slide show.

Photo Editors/Assistant Editors (3 or 4) - These are the more experienced photographers who can teach the other photographers. Good knowledge of photoshop required.

STAFF

Layout Staff: Lays out pages. Some creativity is helpful. You will be assigned to a section but may also need to help out in other sections.

Photographers: Takes photos and edits them. Sometimes the photos are taken in class but these people need to be willing to take events if necessary (usually we get events from newspaper), take candid during non-class time (A-block, lunch, etc) and go to club meetings after school. Photos are generally edited in class. Photo candidates must submit sample photos.

Everyone in yearbook must sell advertising. We need to pay for this.
