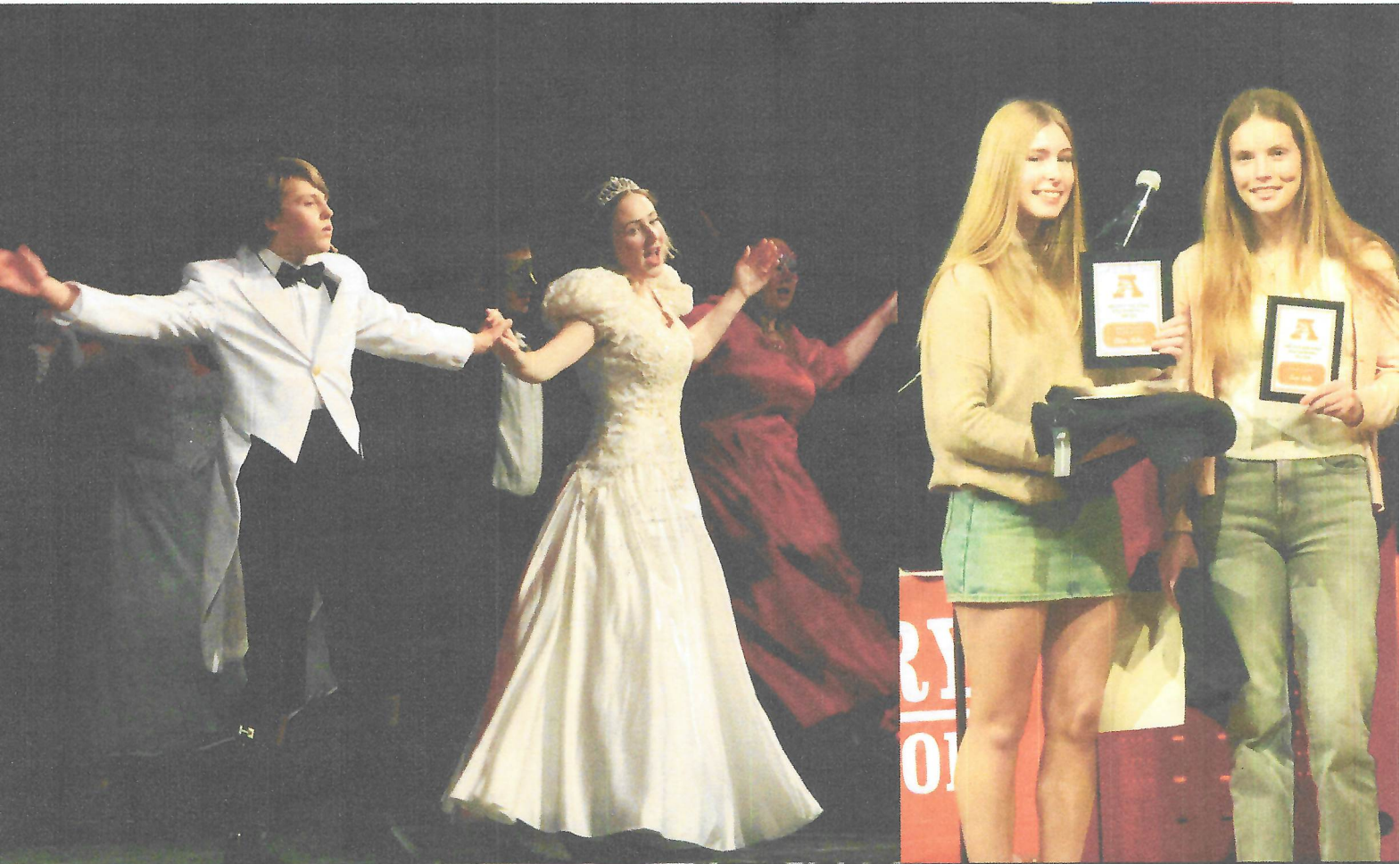

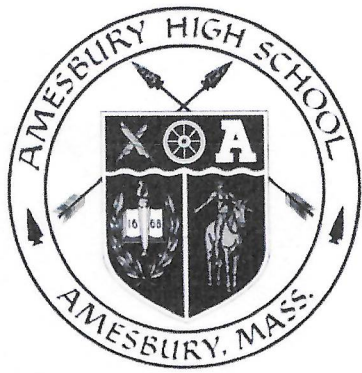

Last Thursday, Friday, and Saturday night the AHS Drama Club presented an enchanting version of Rodger's and Hammerstein's Cinderella, starting Ellie Marden, in the auditorium. The show was directed by Mary Ellen Shirshac, choreographed by Jocelyn Pray, and produced by Susanne Meyer. This may have been the best performance yet for the amazing Ms. Marden, but the sixteen underclassmen in the cast showed there will be no lack of talent left when she graduates, especially Nora Primack (Fairy Godmother), Madison Martin (stepsister Gabrielle), Carol Costantino (stepsister Charlotte), and the charming Andrew Roberts (Prince Topher).

The story line goes like this: Cinderella is a kind-hearted young woman living under the control of her vain and selfish stepmother, Madame (Heather Weatherell), and her two stepsisters, who treat her as the household servant since her father died. Ella is not allowed to go to the ball, but after her evil relative leaves, the strange old crazy lady, Mary, turns into her Fairy Godmother (Nora Premack) and provides a beautiful dress and a magical pumpkin coach for Ella to attend the ball until the magic ends at midnight. No one recognizes Ella in this attire, but Prince Topher is immediately smitten. At midnight Ella runs off without a word, and Topher sends his entire

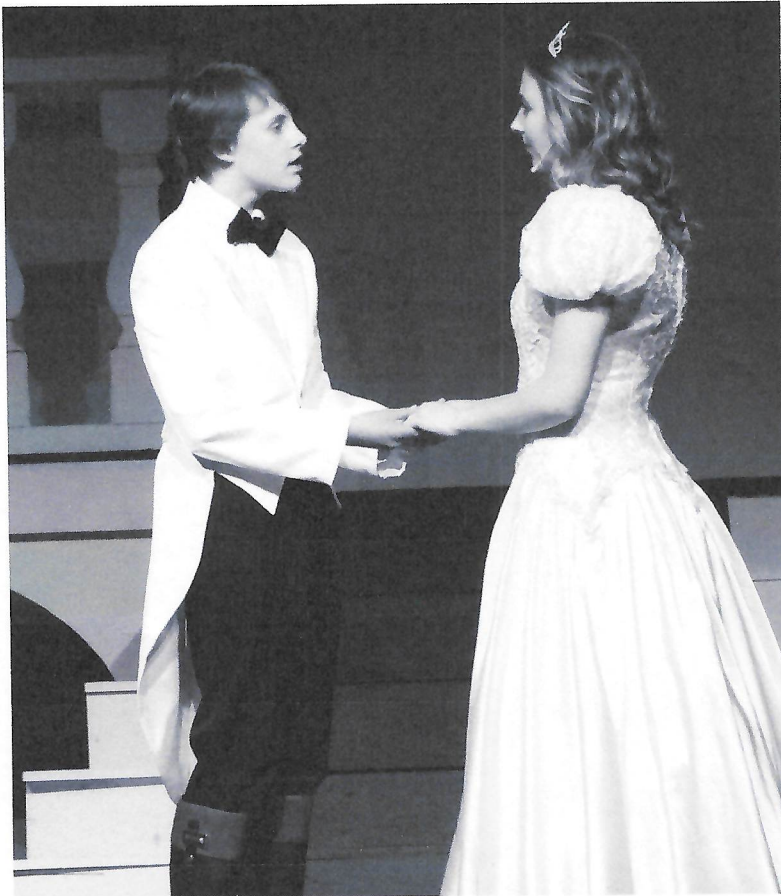

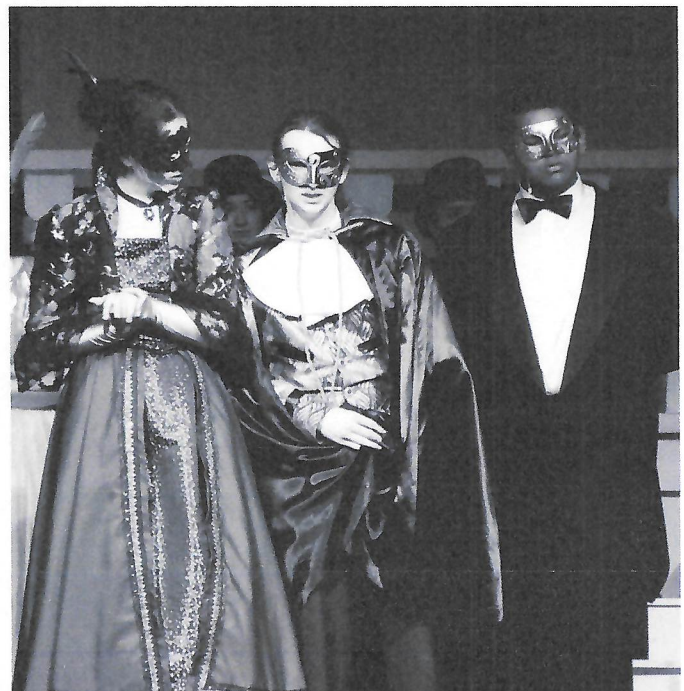

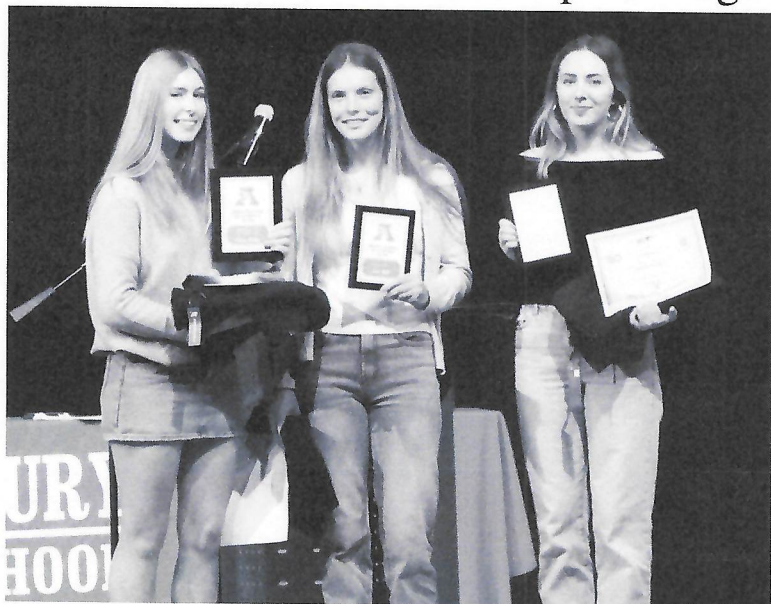

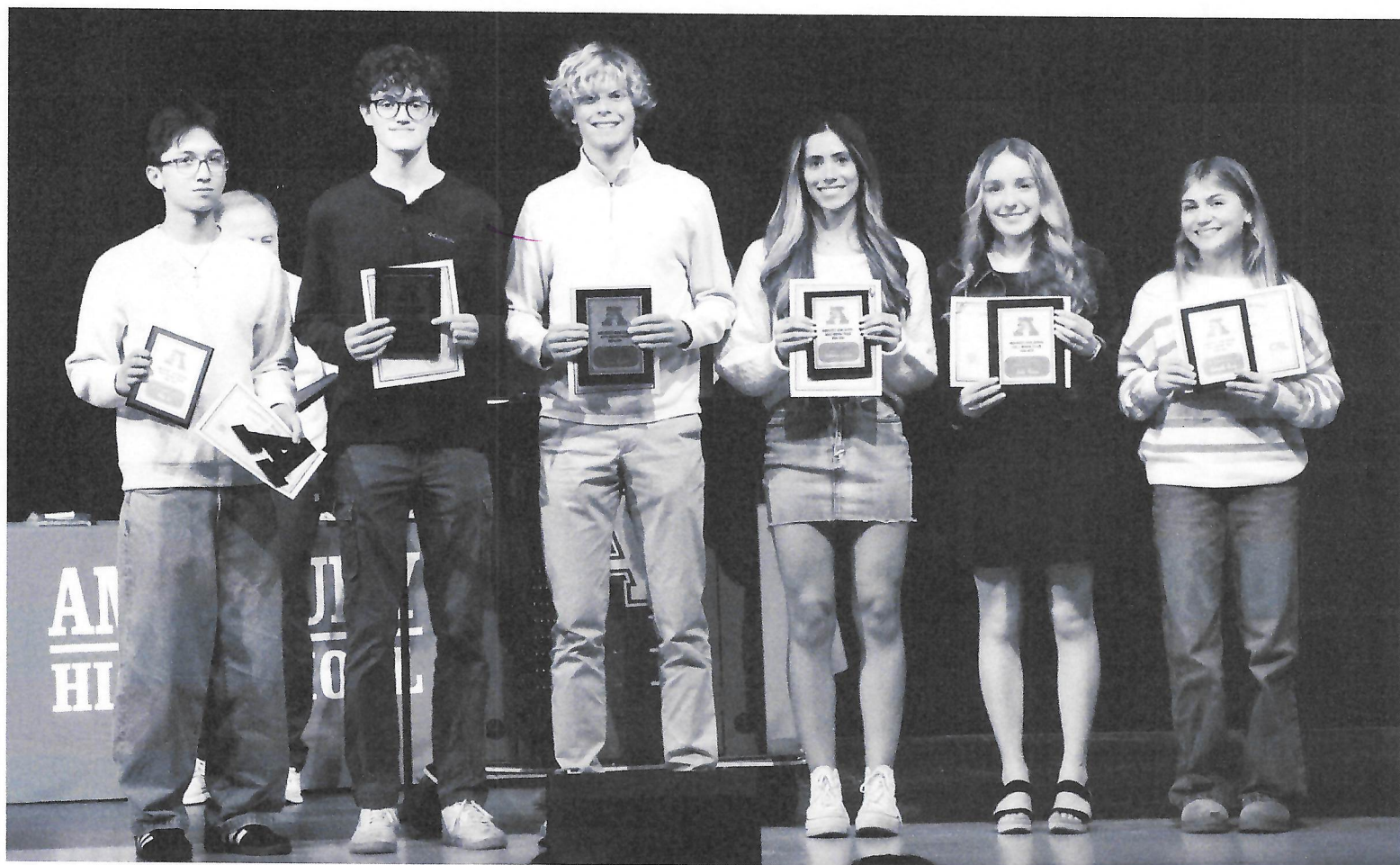

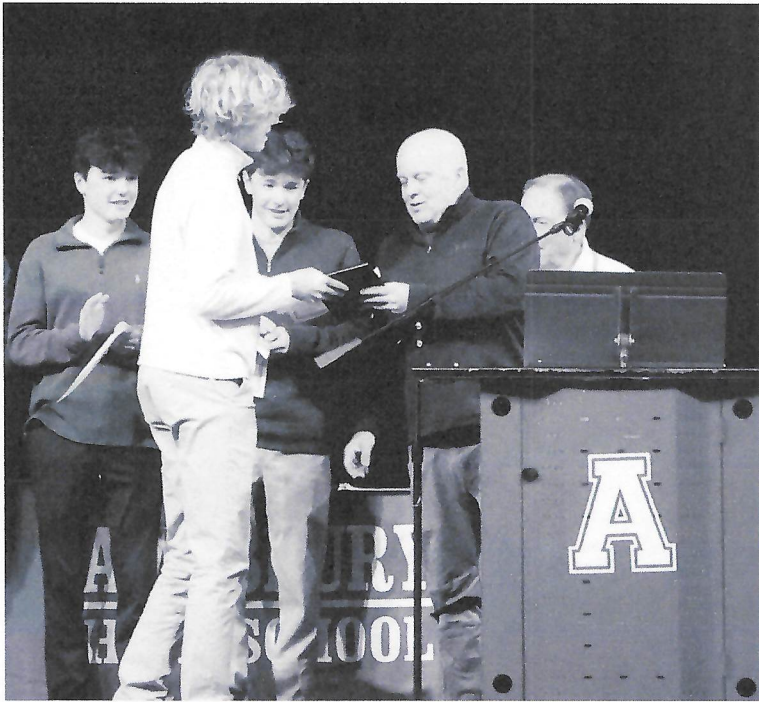

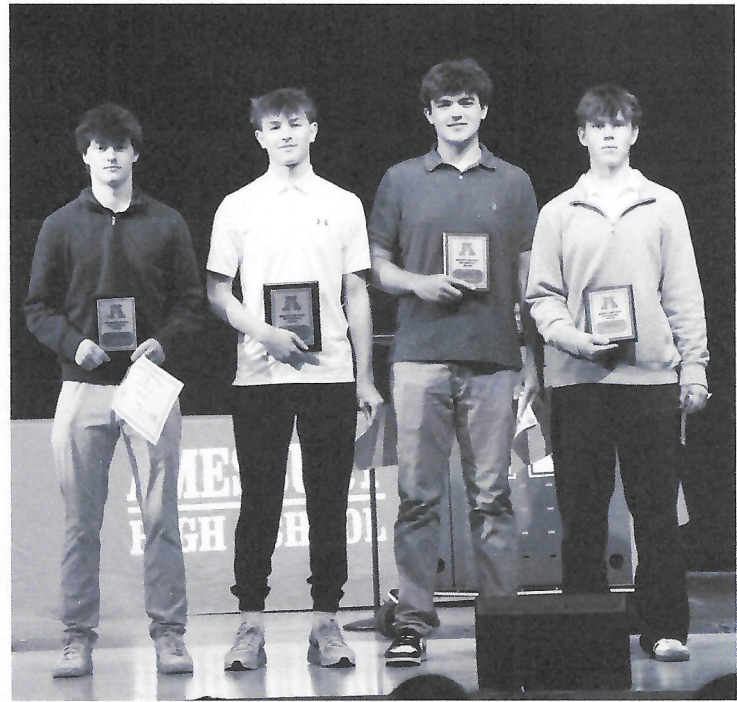

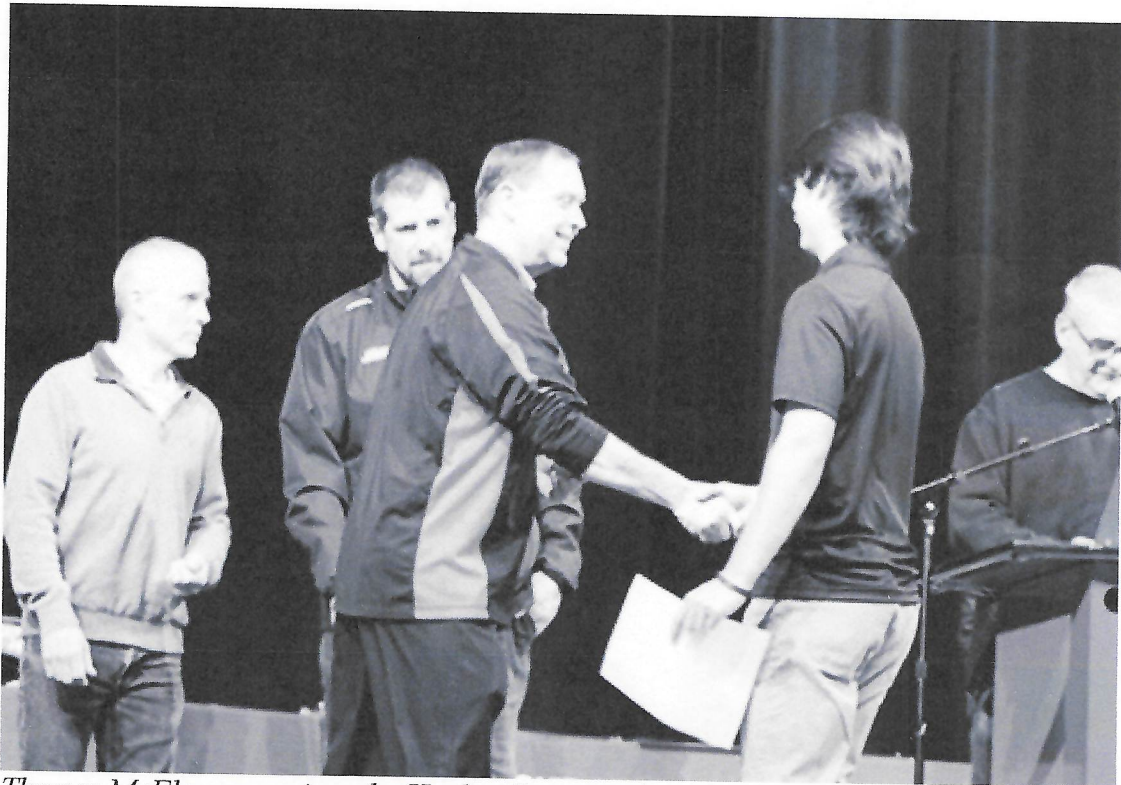

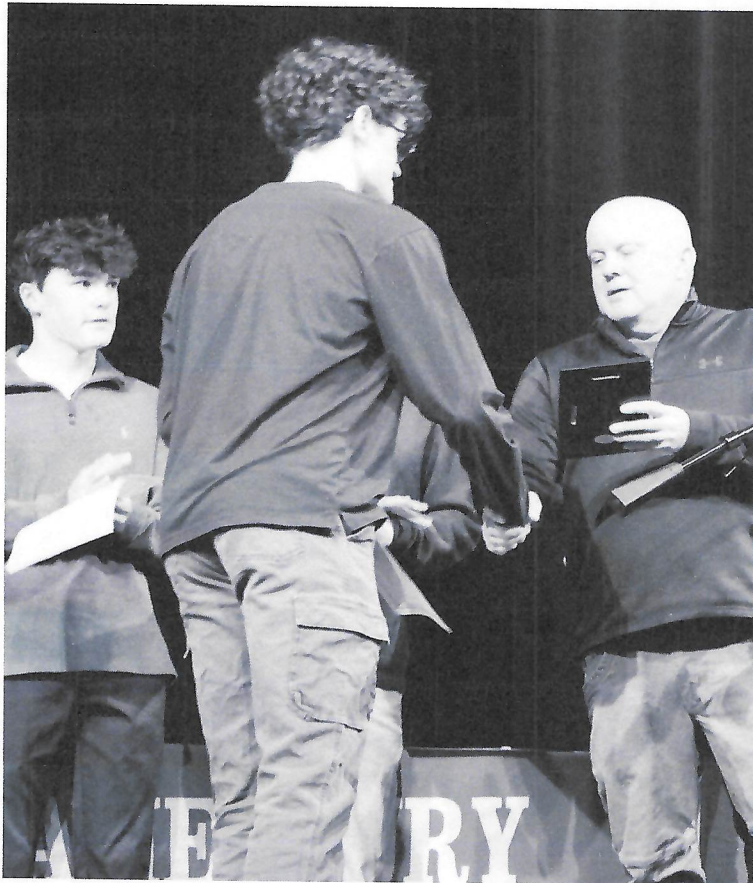

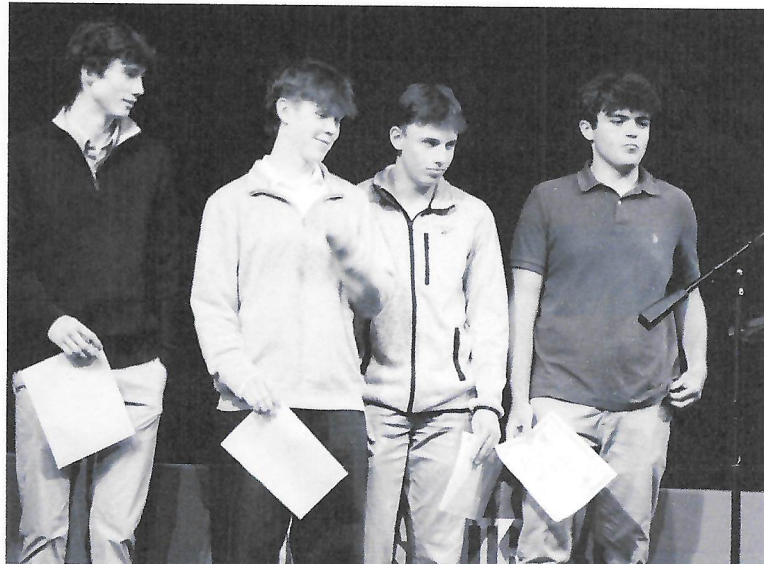

spaceship, and infinite food and water. Yummy!

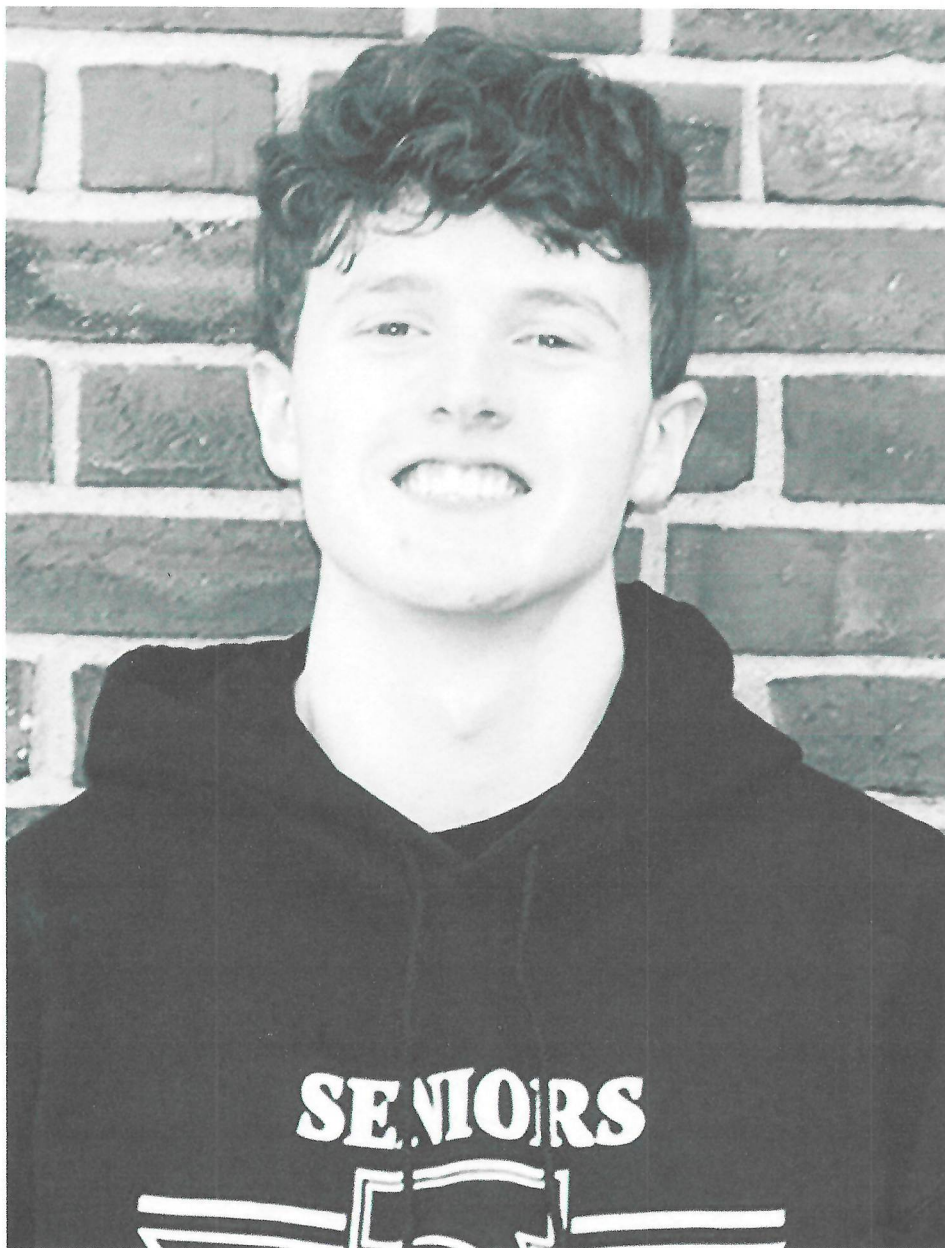
