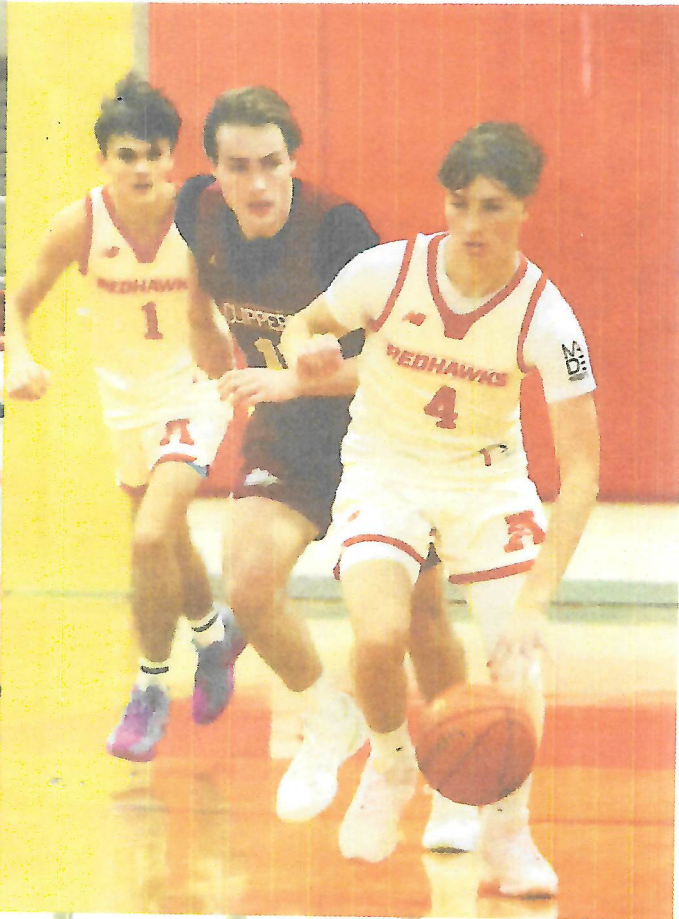

Other musical productions coming up are Cinderella March 13-15, and the annual Evening of the Arts on April 2nd.

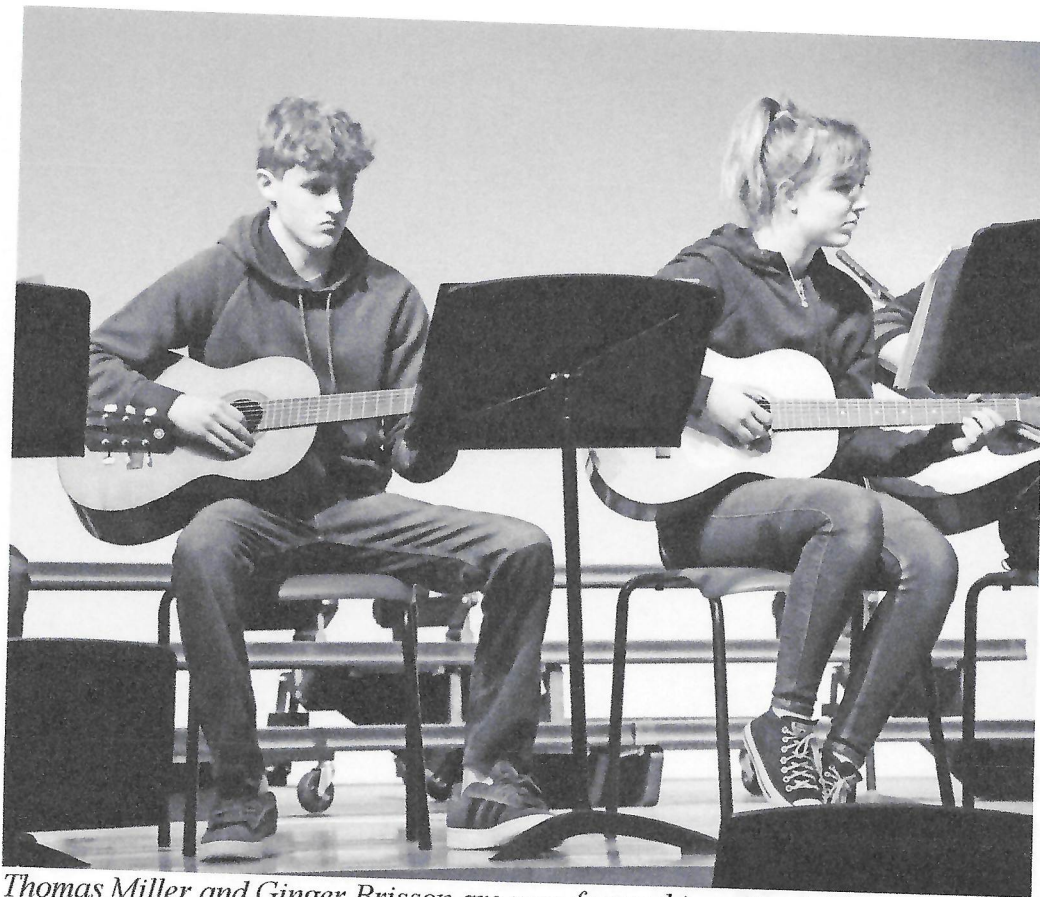

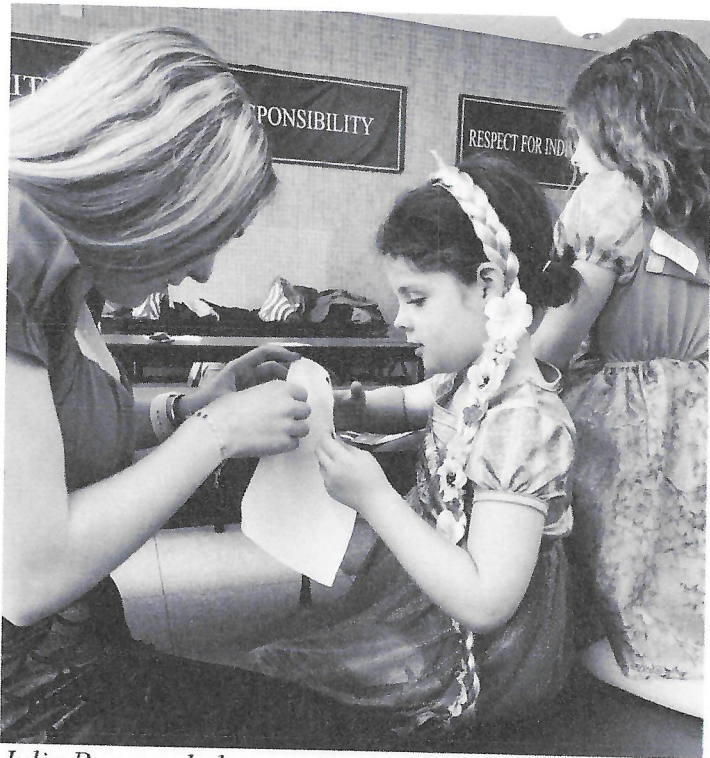

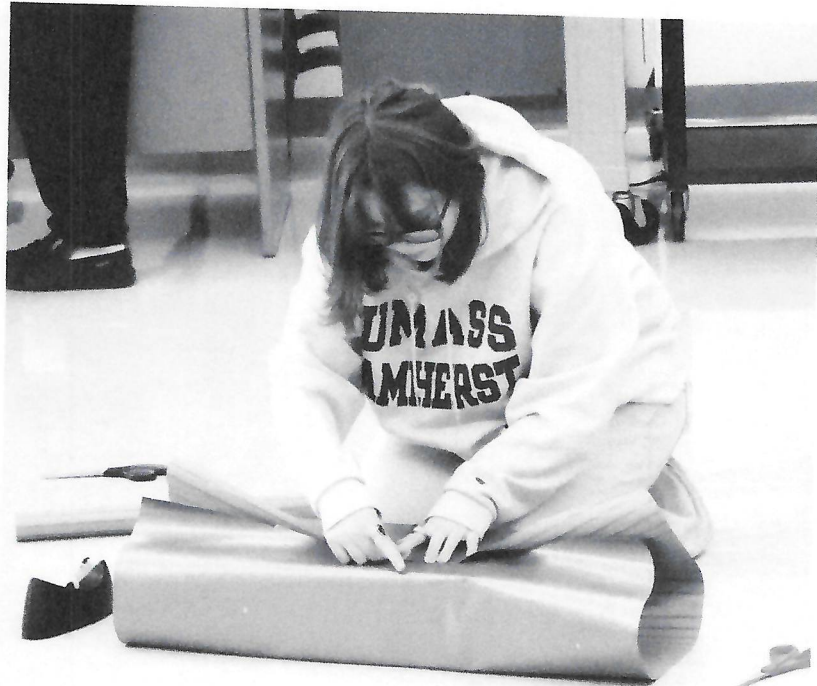

Boys Basketball

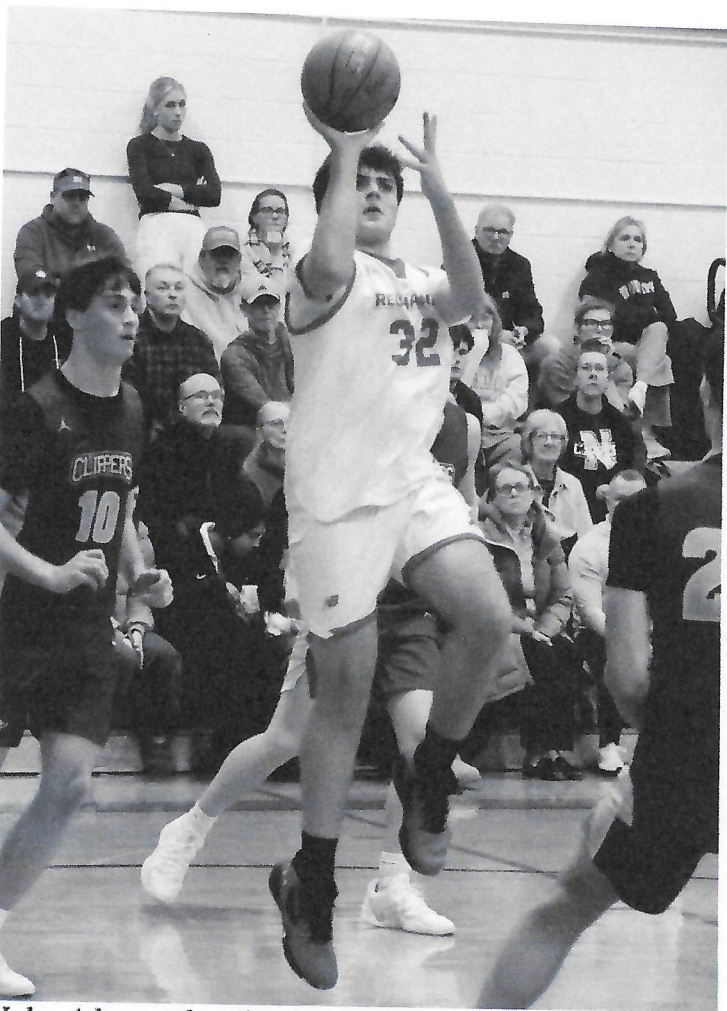

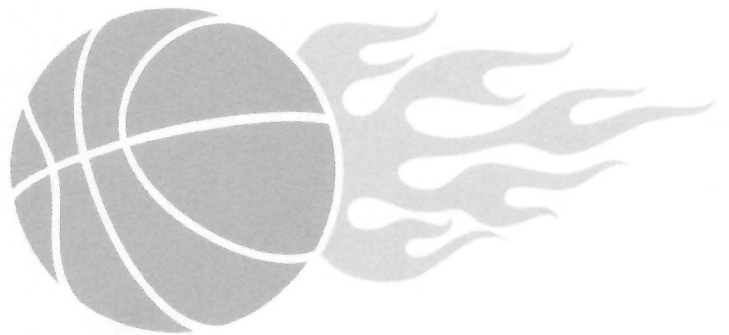
Wednesday night the Redhawks played North Reading at North Reading. Tonight they face Manchester Essex at home.

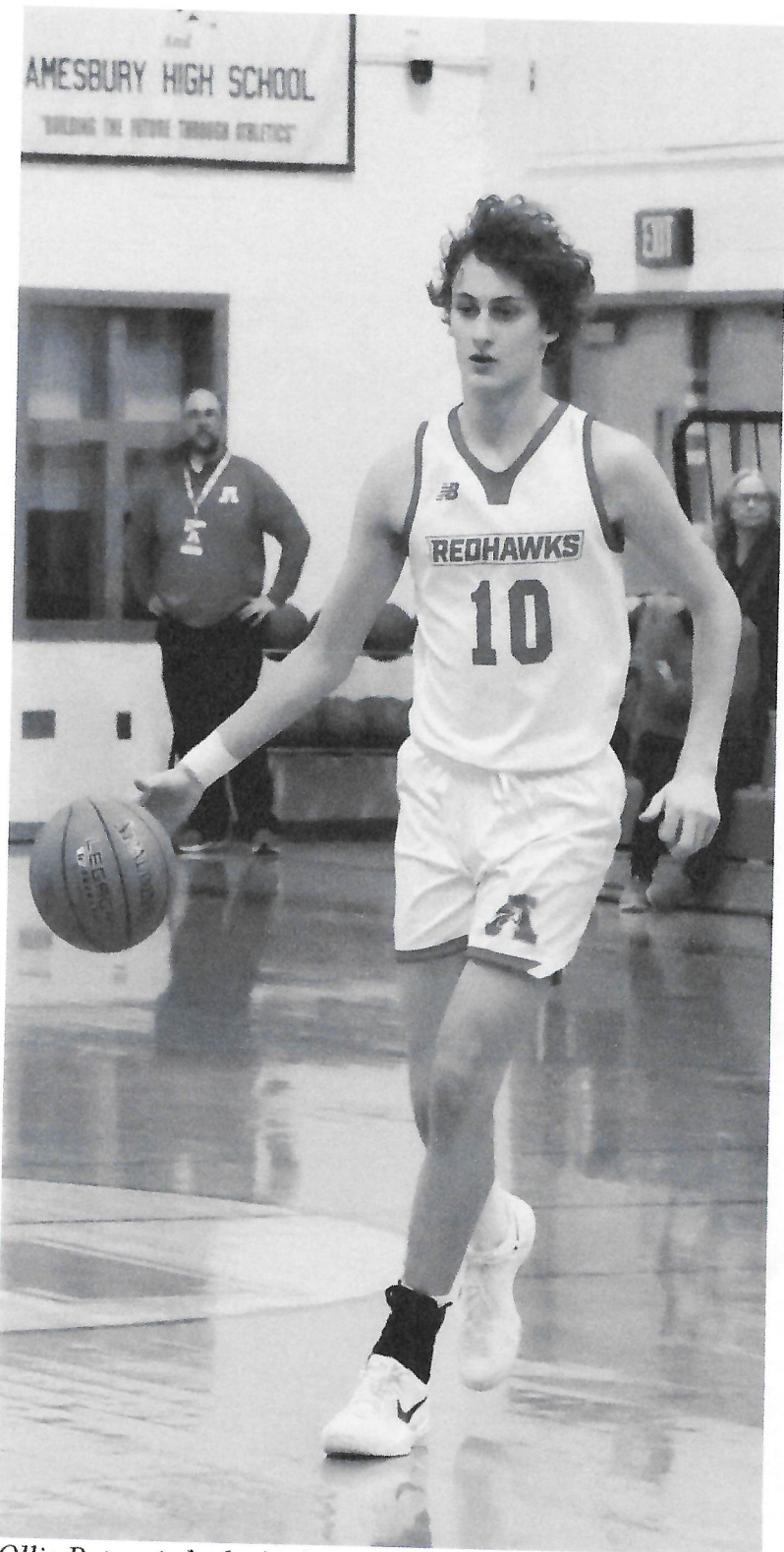

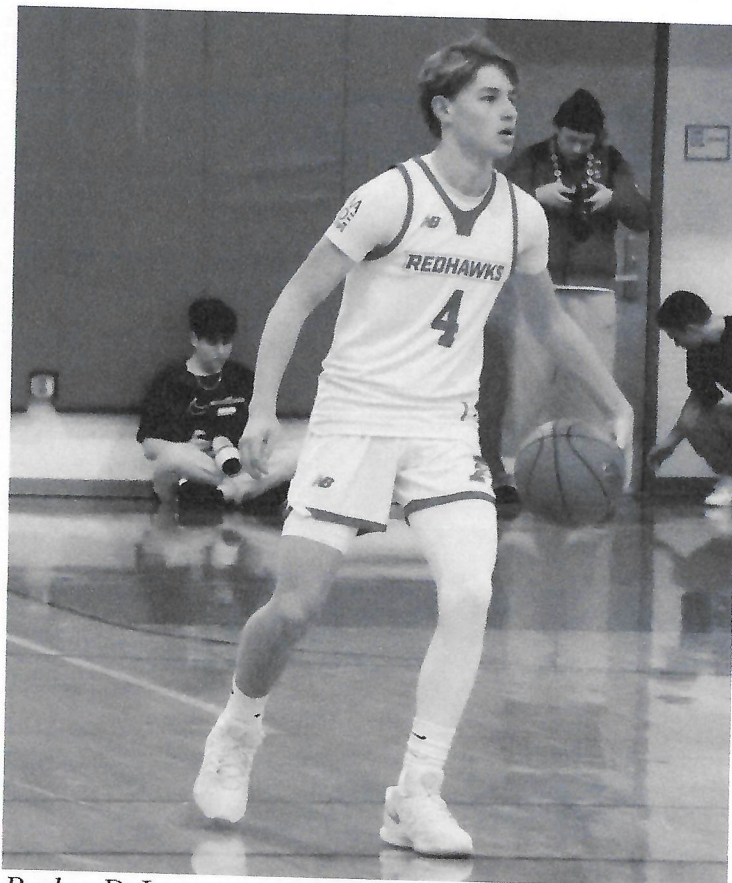

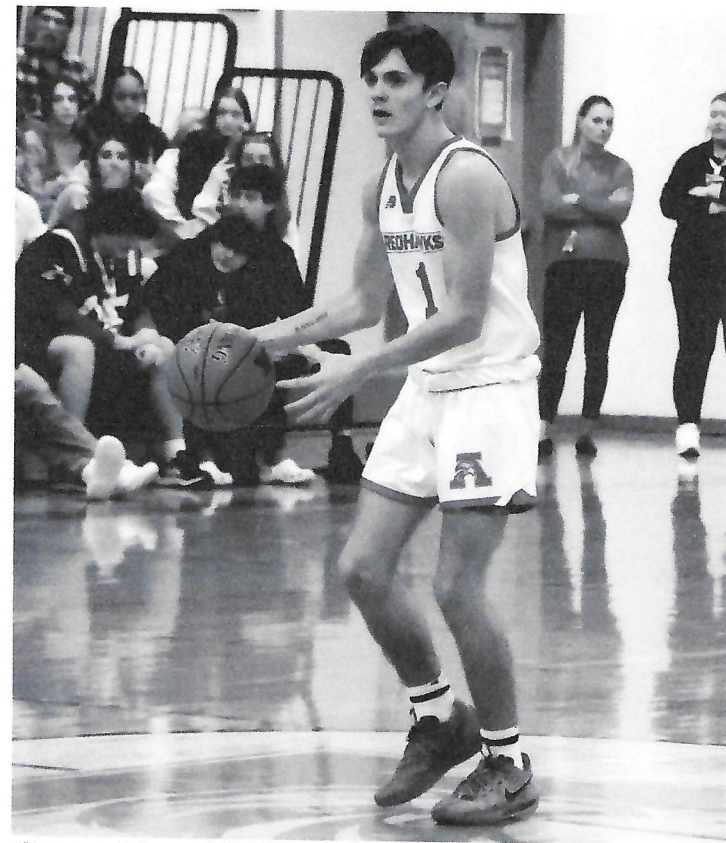

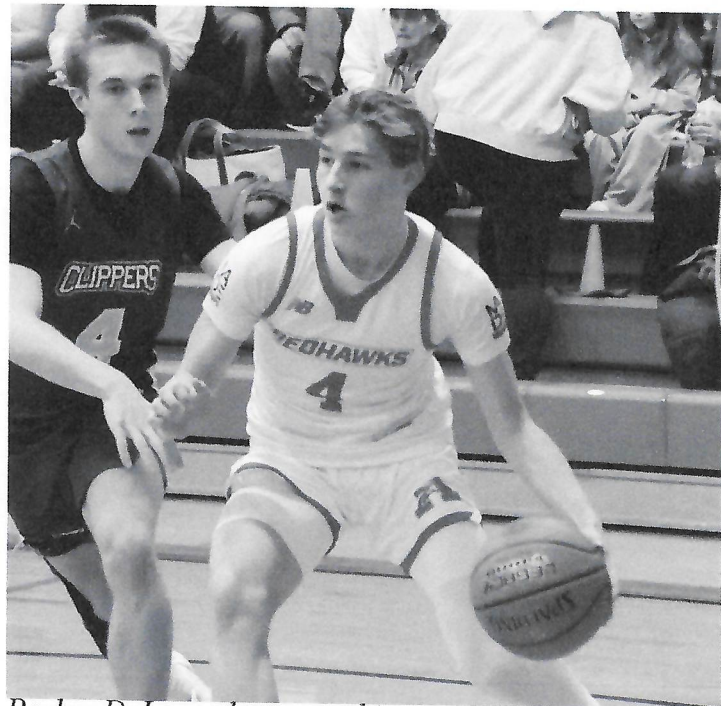

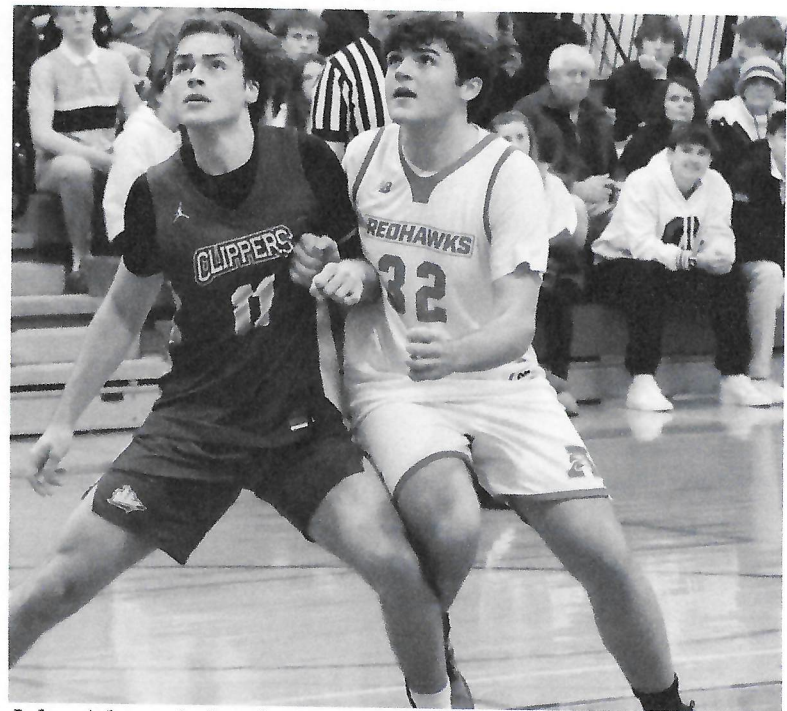

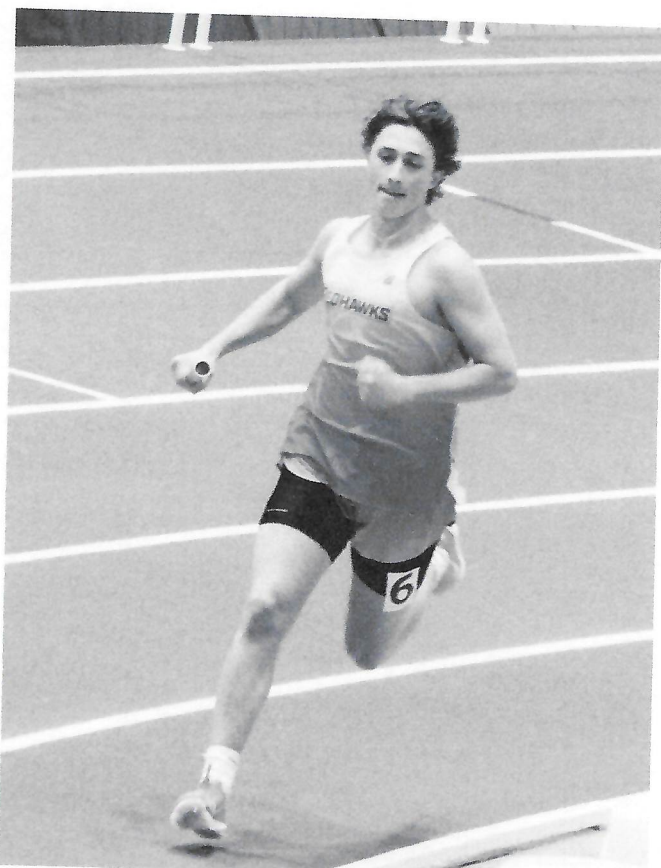
WINNERS AND LOSERS

The boys' track team picked up their second win, 79-20, and the girls suffered their second loss, 43-57, at the New Balance Track in Boston on Tuesday. They were playing Manchester Essex.

On the boys' side, Noah Blouin won the 300 meters and the long jump. Josiah Fugate was first in the 1000 meters and mile. Connor Scialdone won the 55 meter hurdles and the high jump. Amesbury actually swept the high jump with DJ DiCarl second and Brody Hall third. Amesbury also swept the 600 meters with Maxx Rodrigas first, Andrew Parsons second, and Landon Mitchell third. Brody Hall won the two mile. Marcus Colon and Lucas Ferriera went one-two in the shot put. Joe Puleo had a pair of seconds in the 55 meters and 300 meters. Amesbury also won the 4 x 400 meter relay

On the girls' side the only firsts were Lexi Desmond in the 300 meters, Lindsey Williamson in the 55 meter hurdles, and Samya Clark in the shot put. Amesbury actually swept the shot put with Julia Losee second and Lexi LeBlanc third. Other seconds went to Lexi Desmond (55 meter hurdles), Haley Jezowski (high jump), and Della Hildt (long jump). Julia Parsons had a pair of thirds in the mile and two mile and Lauren Talbot was third in the 300 meters.

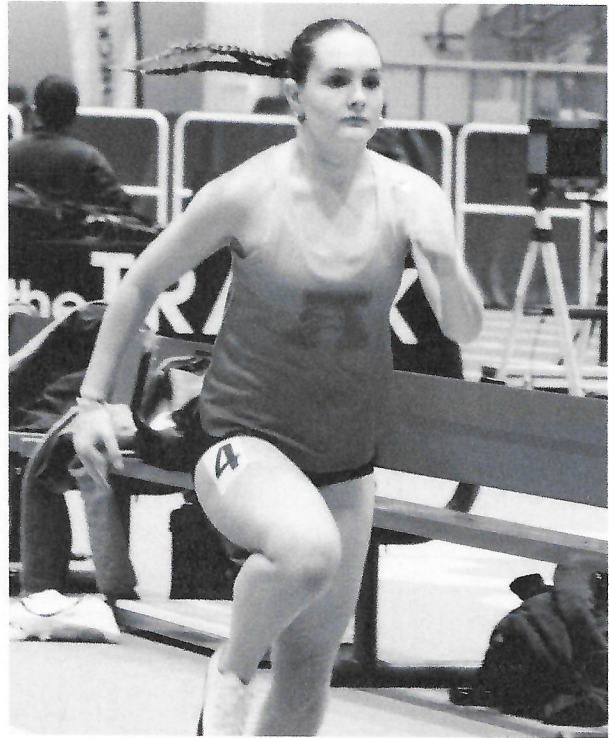

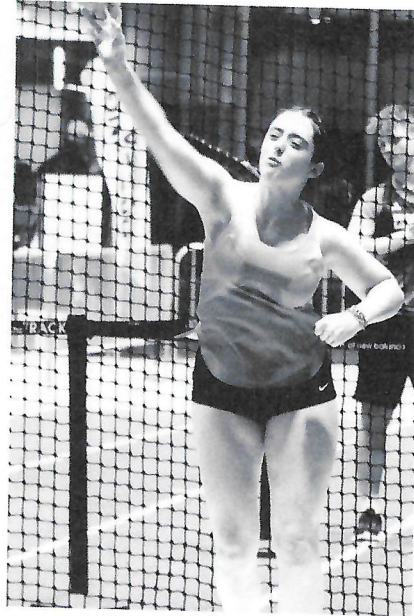
