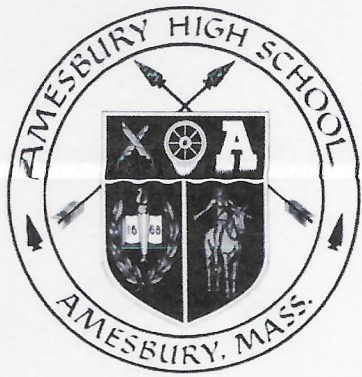

FIGHT FOR WHATS RIGHT!

Budget Hearing

The school budget blues are back, and things seem even worse than last year. The School Committee instructed Superintendent McAndrews to create a level services budget. The means all programs remain the same. However, prices on just about everything have skyrocketed, so a level services budget would really amount to an 8.4% increase in needed funds. That amounts to \$3,200,000.

We can only guess that the School Committee felt that would not fly with the city council, which has the final say on the budget. Therefore, they instructed McAndrews to prepare two other budgets, one with a 5% increase and one with a 3% increase. The problem is that, after last year's cuts, there are no "less important" things to cut in the budget, so McAndrews had to cut into some pretty significant programs, which brought screams of protest.

Monday night, the School Committee held their annual budget hearing. Anyone could show up to comment on the proposed cuts and they did. About 300 people were in the auditorium, and the show went

on for nearly four hours, starting at 6PM. The School Committee's job at this event is to listen to what people have to say, not to take any actual votes on anything.

By far the biggest group in the auditorium were students and teachers from AIHS. Under the 5% plan, that school would be moved to a separate space, probably at the high school. One possibility would be the area where the central office staff is now. If AIHS comes to the high school, the central office would move out. Students, parents, and teachers were all opposed

to moving AIHS, which is currently in a space rented from the Anglican Church on Friend Street for \$210,000 a year (equivalent to three teachers salaries). The Innovation contingent were opposed to moving AIHS into any other school, even if it was in a separate area. The general consensus of this argument was that having a separate building would destroy the school. Everyone agreed that AIHS itself was a great thing.

The second biggest thing on the

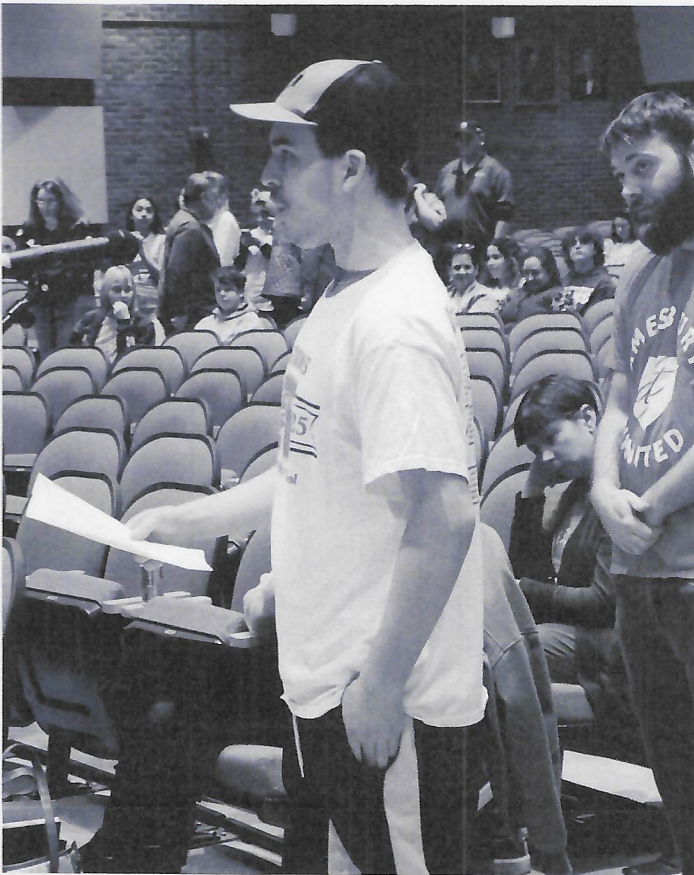

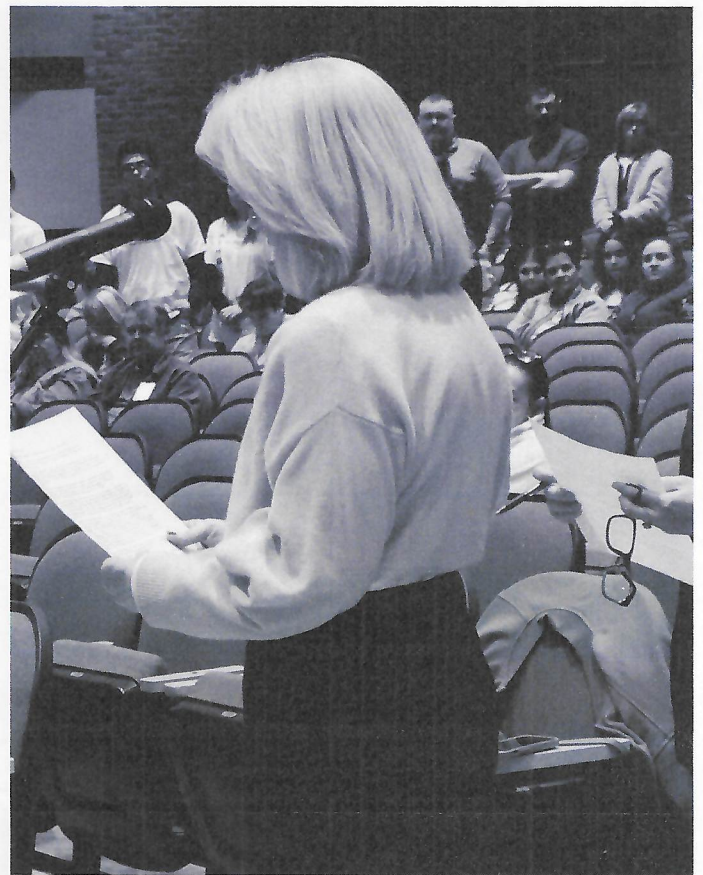

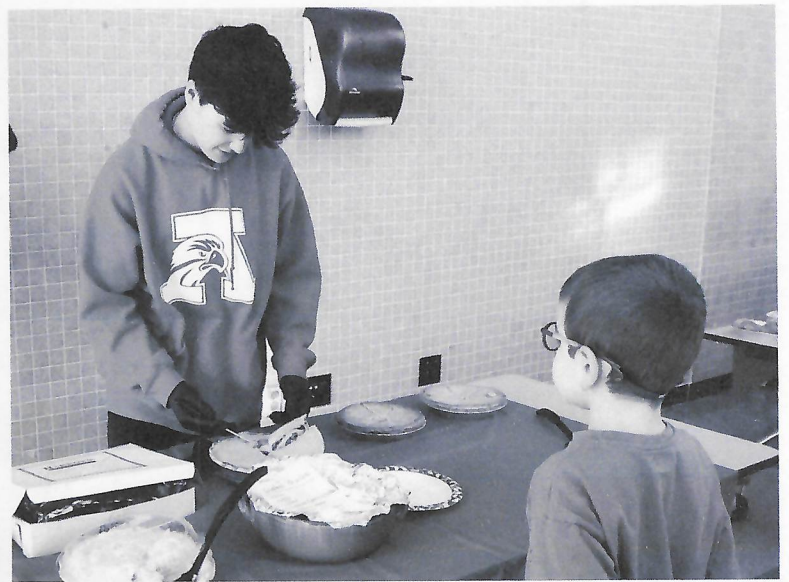

Mrs. Lingley can be called Dr. Lingley from now. The assistant principal recently completed her doctoral work after three years at Boston University. Lingley's thesis was titled "World History: Analysis of Teacher Autonomy of Content and Diversity within Curriculum." The point of the project was to determine how much autonomy world history teachers felt they had in a subject which could be quite diverse. She interviews seven world history teachers and analyzed numerous documents to determine that the teachers really felt they had a lot of autonomy in structuring their courses, but there were barriers to what they could teach in terms of money, languages, and even students' inability to read cursive.

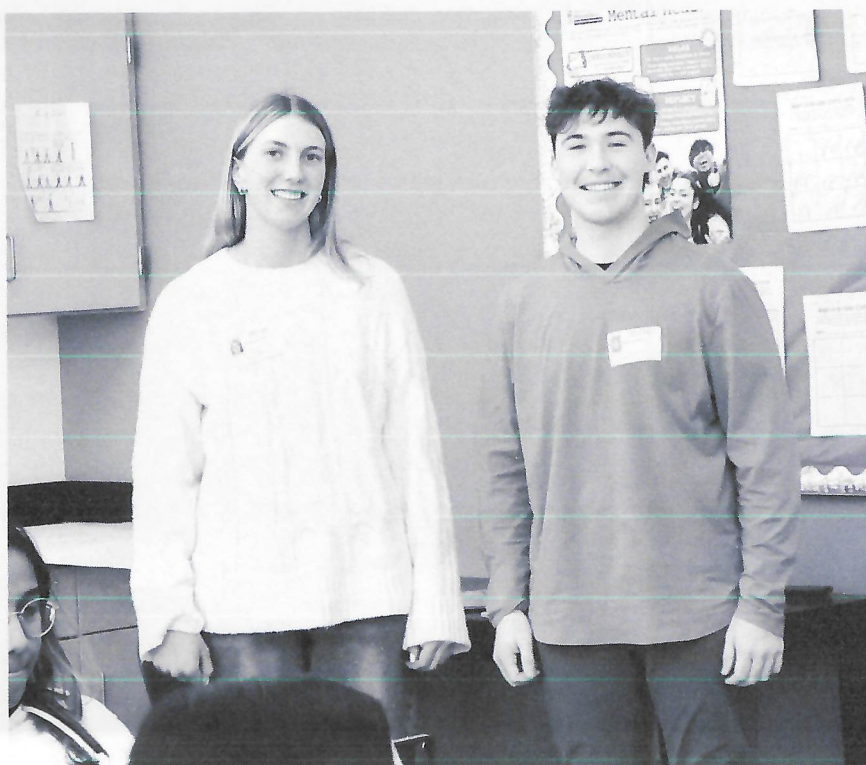


WHERE'S THE POOL

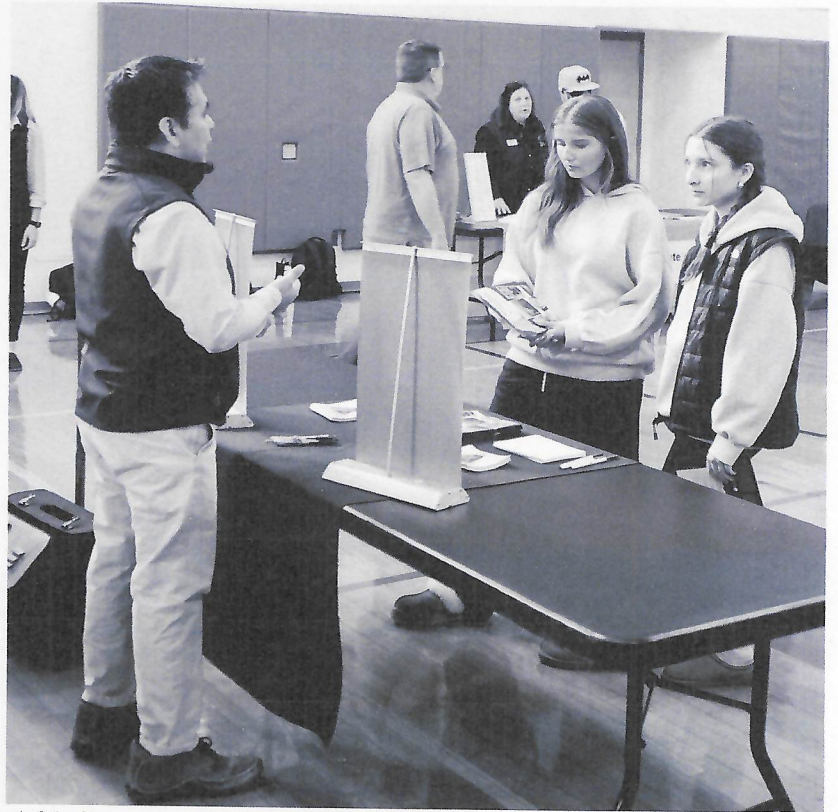

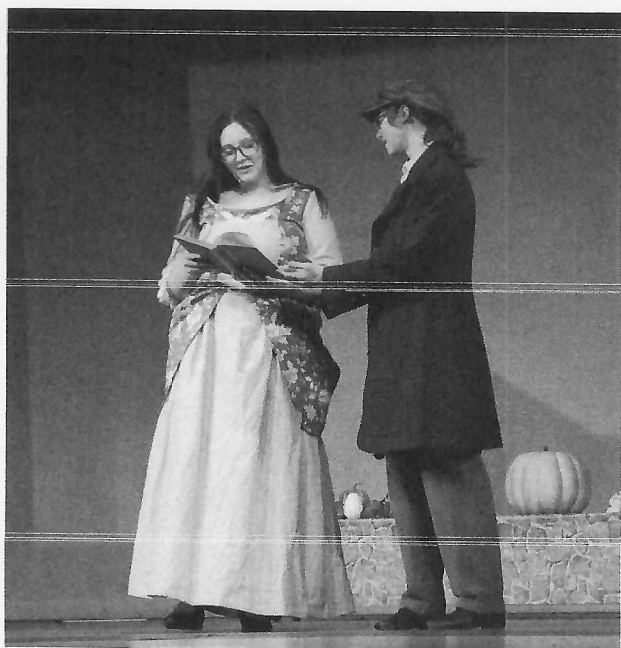

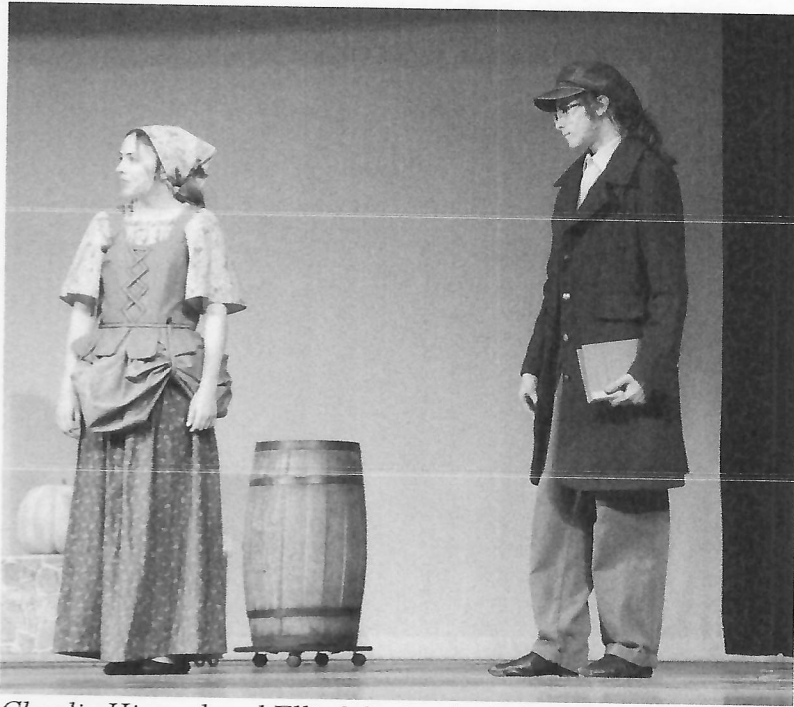
