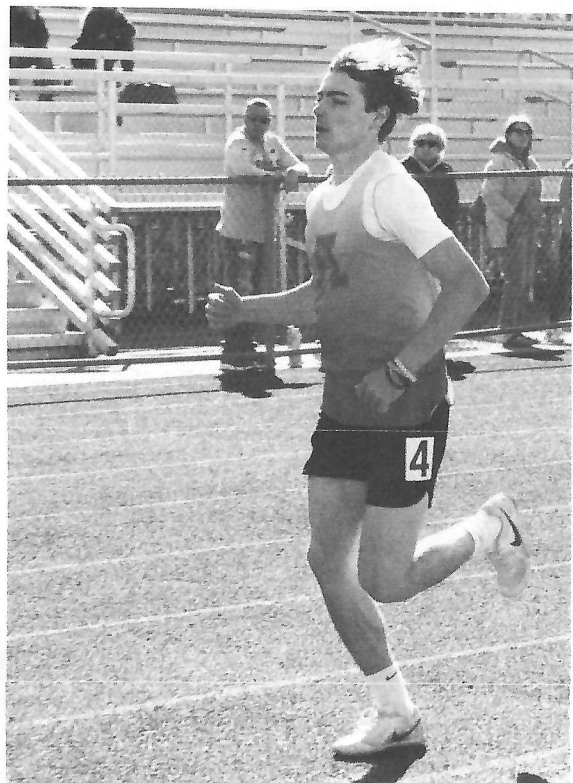

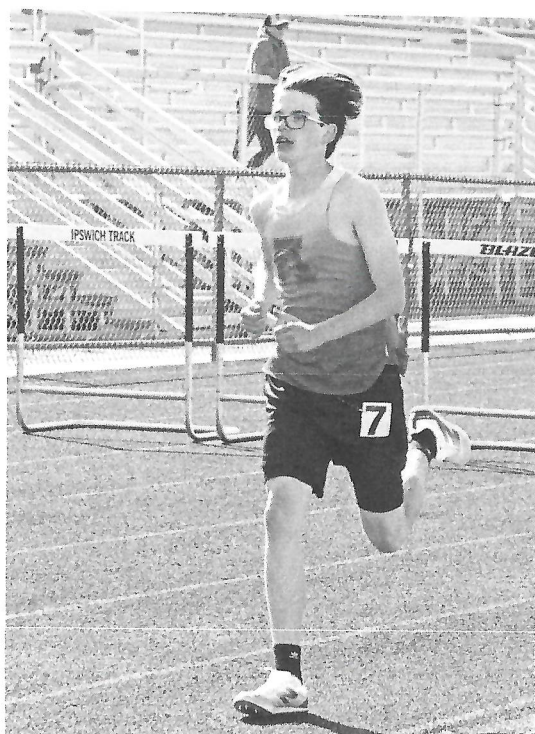

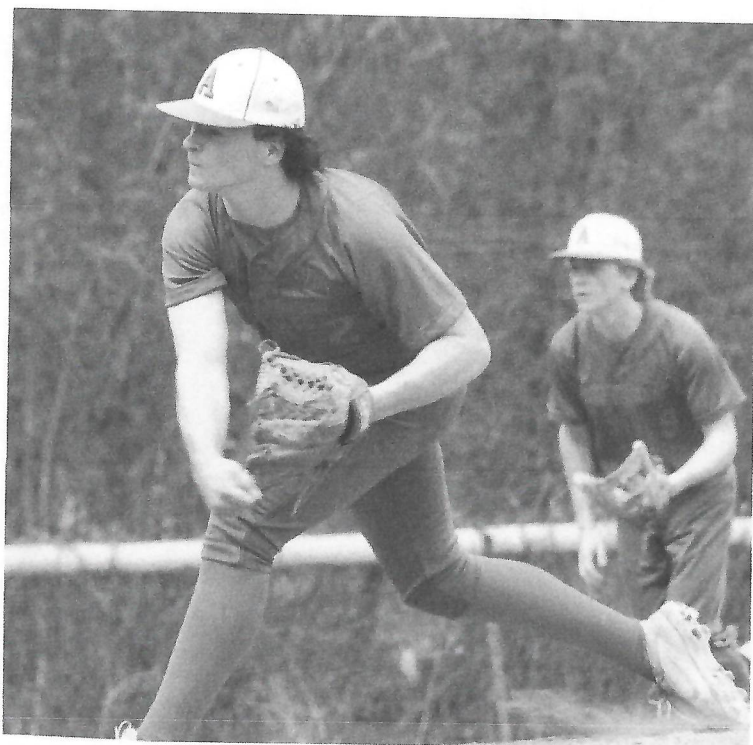
The baseball team finally seems to be turning it around. After a string of loses, the team has won three of their last four games.

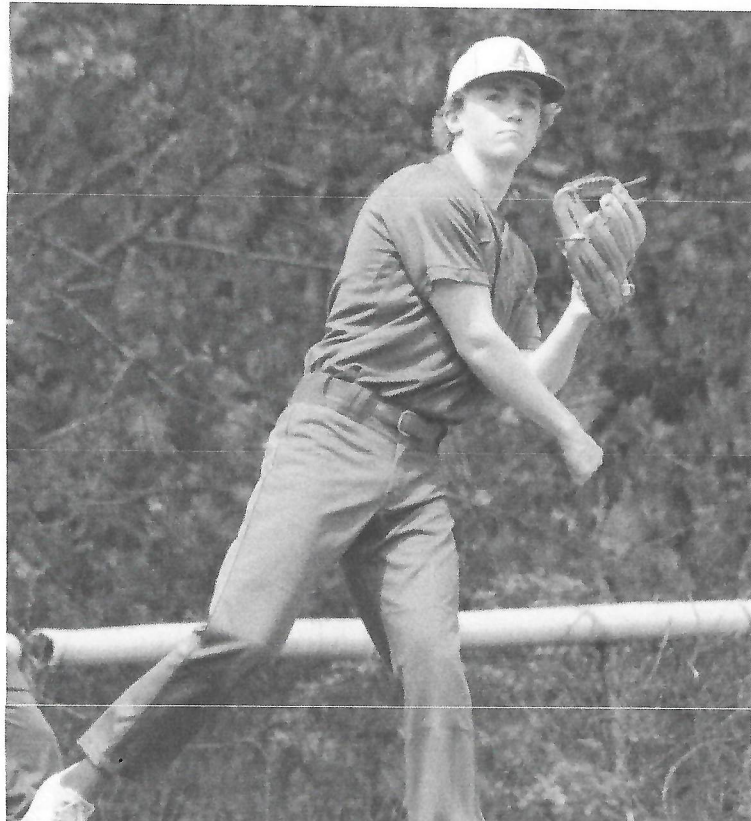

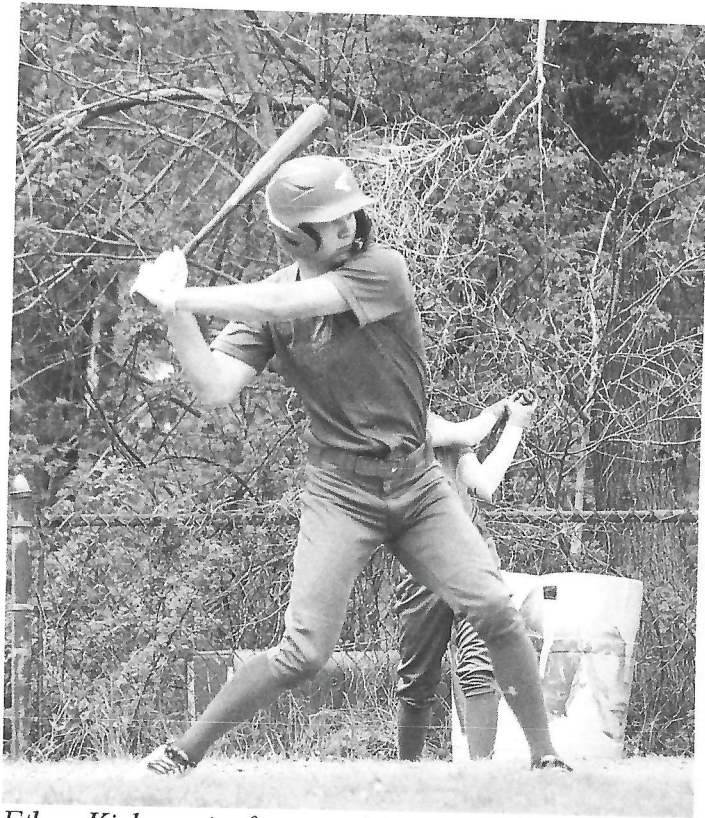

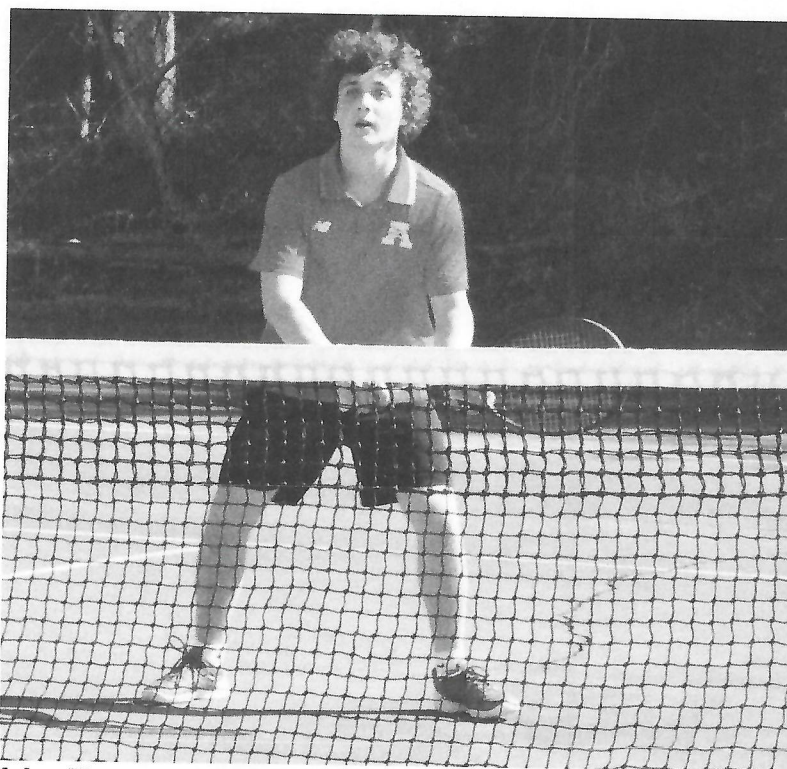


# SUCCESS!

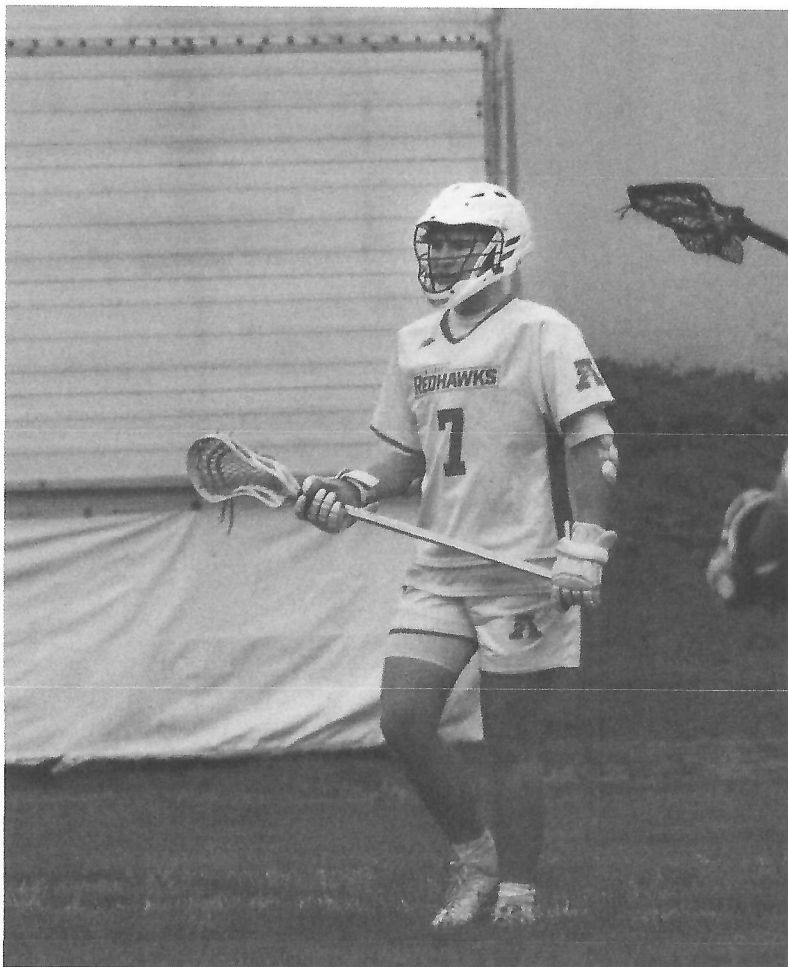
# HIT EM WITH YOUR BEST SHOT

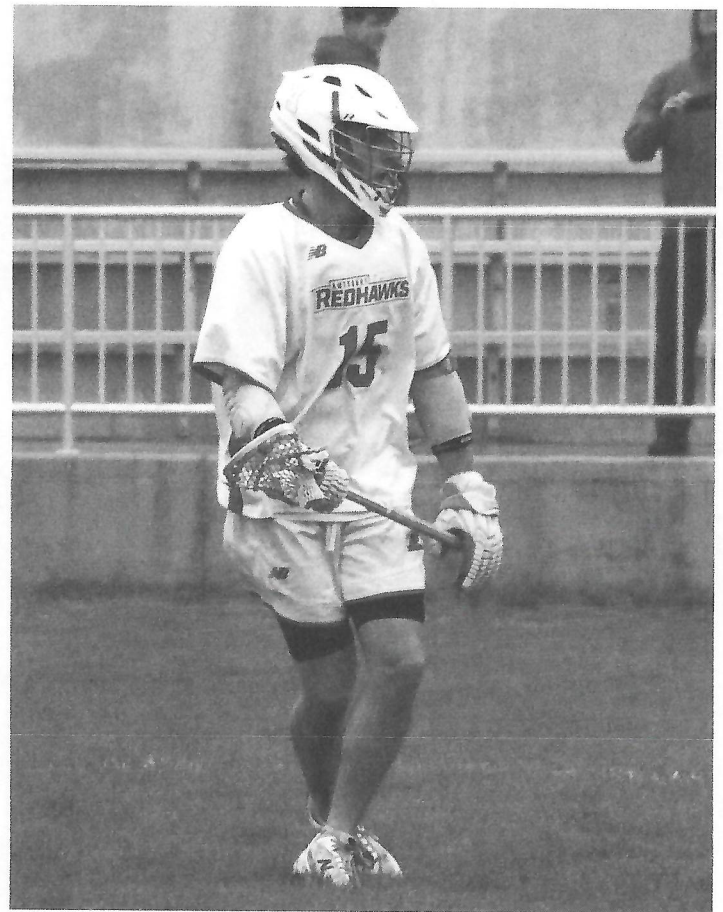
