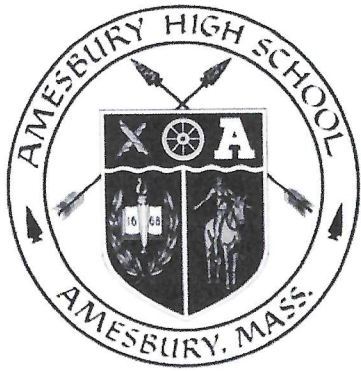

Did you know you could participate in wrestling at AHS? Amesbury kids can participate on the Whittier team and have been able to do so for nearly 20 years, according to Athletic Director Glen Gearin. This cooperative effort was created by Superintendent Elizabeth McAndrews when she was the athletic director because Amesbury could not field enough students for their own team. Although Amesbury has not sent students to Whittier for wrestling every year, one year an AHS student was captain of the team.

This year Amesbury sent four wrestlers to Whittier: Nick Anderson, Keith Welch, John DePolo, and Aiden Stuart.

Anderson, a junior, started wrestling when he came to high school. Before that he was in to jujitsu, so he felt this was a natural transition. He competes in the

heavy weight division. He said he likes the sport because your success only depends on you. He didn't know his record offhand.

Welsh, a sophomore, has been wrestling since fifth grade. He competes in the 138-144 division. Before his two years

wrestling two months ago. He became interested because his father wrestled. He participate in the 175-190 point division. As the new guy he doesn't always get to participate, but in his 8 matches he has a 6-2 record. He said, "I enjoy the physical aspects of the sport, as well as the amazing team and how everyone pushes others to learn and do better. 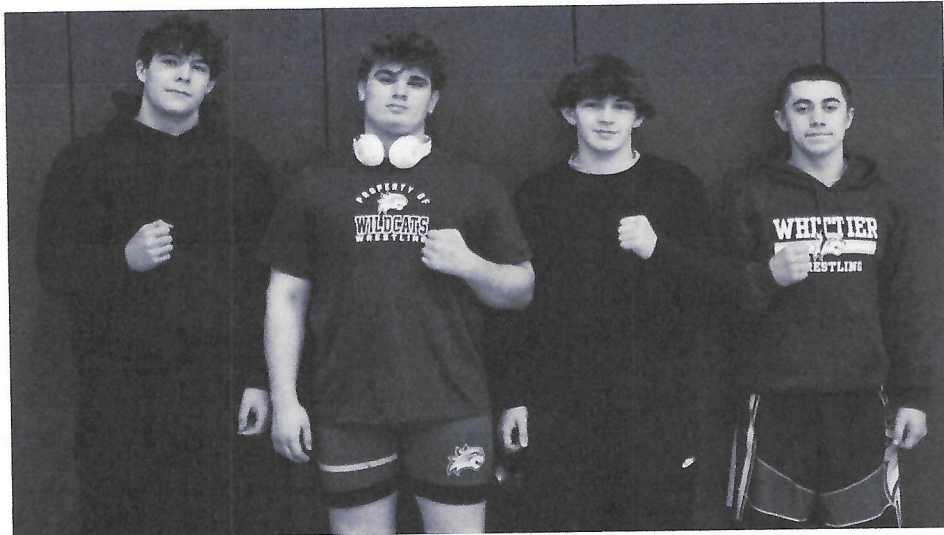
All of these three gentlemen said they planned to continue wrestling

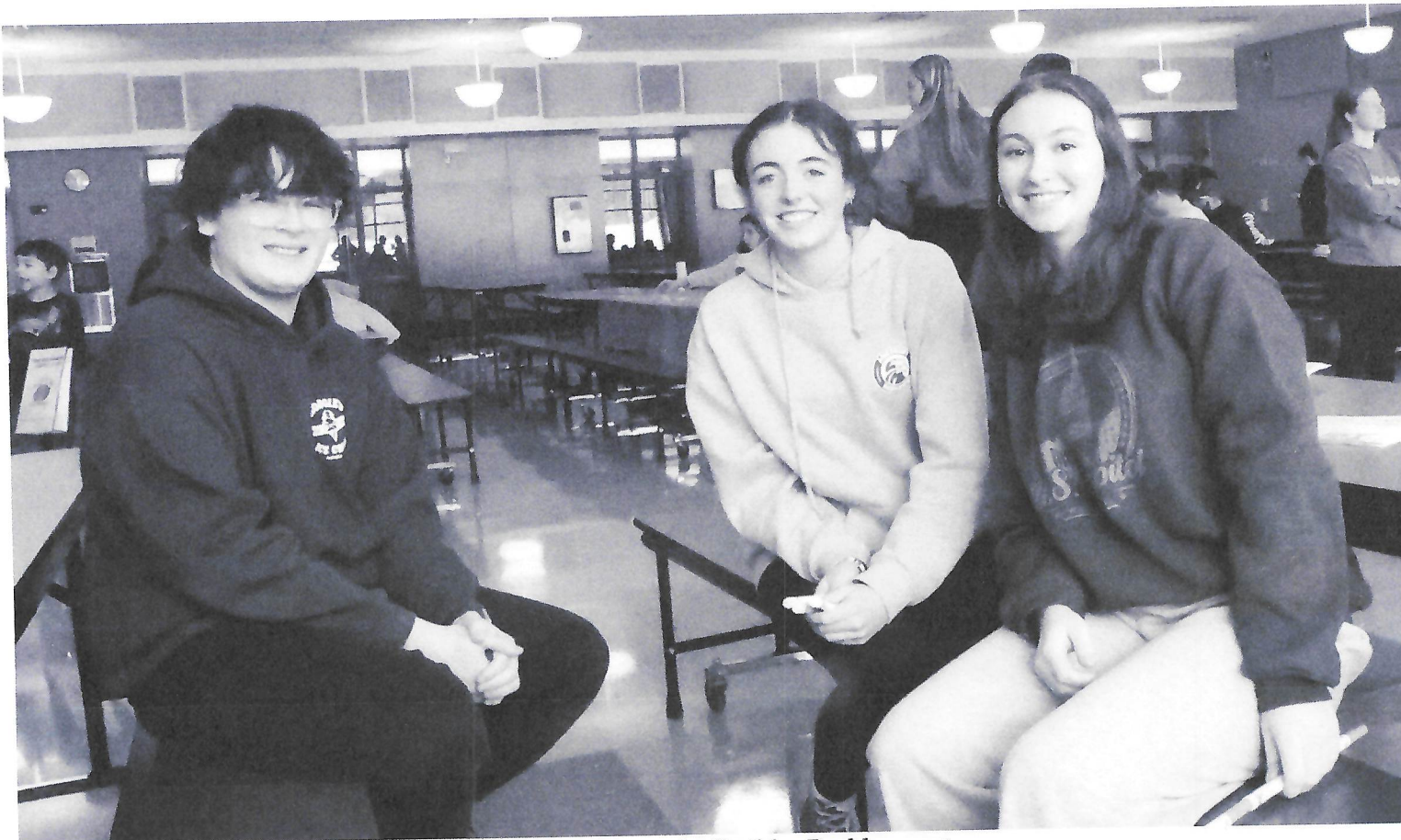
Build a Buddy

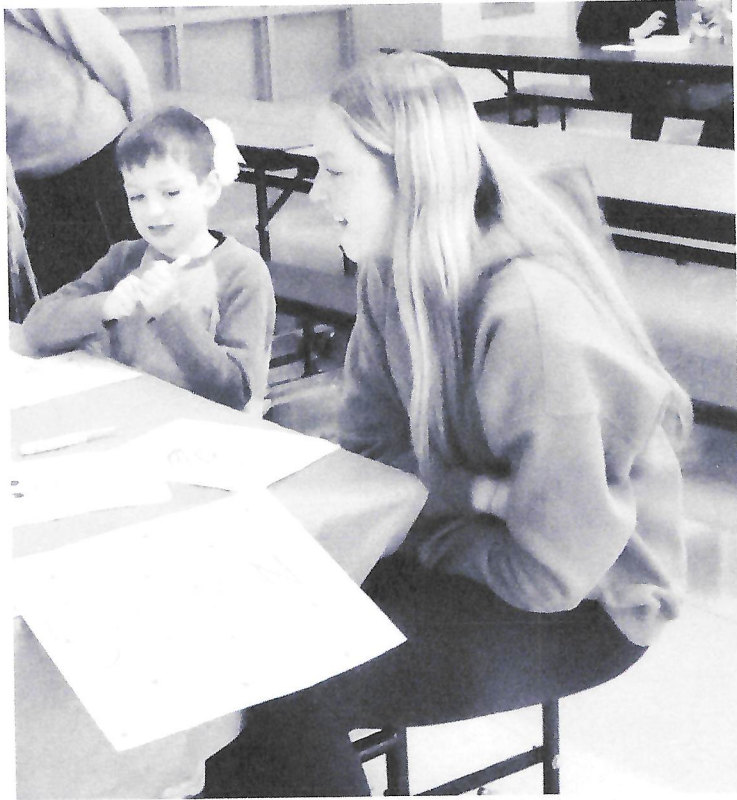

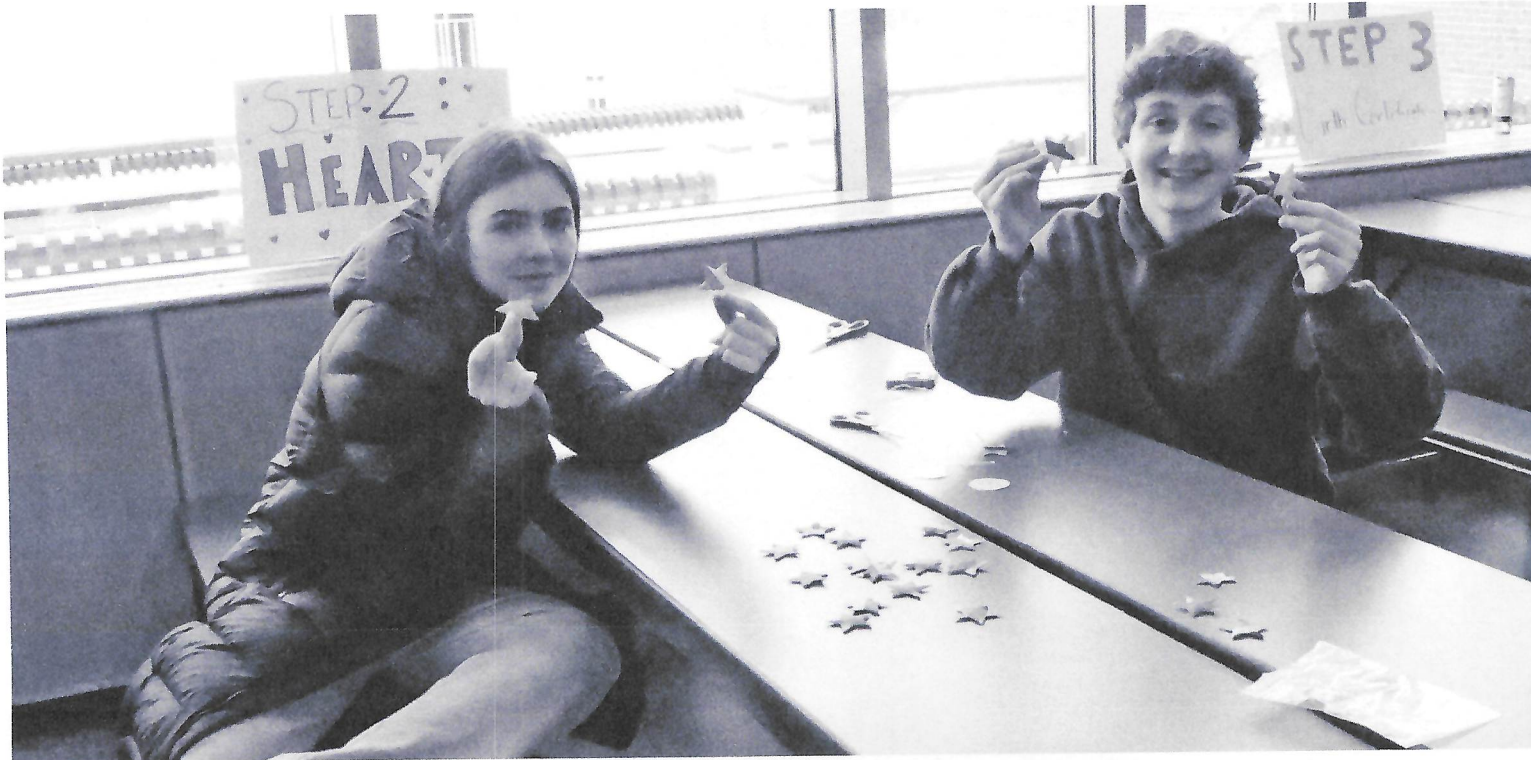

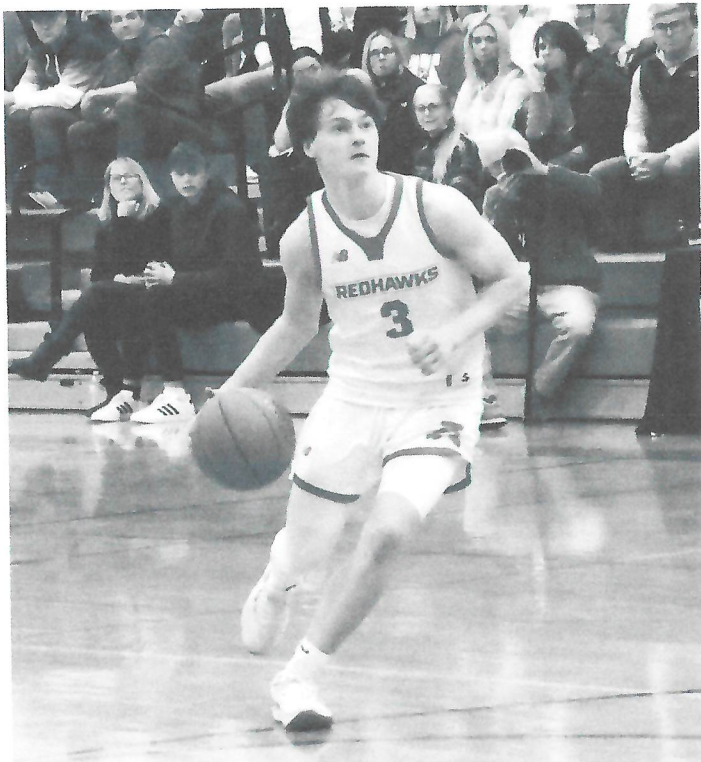

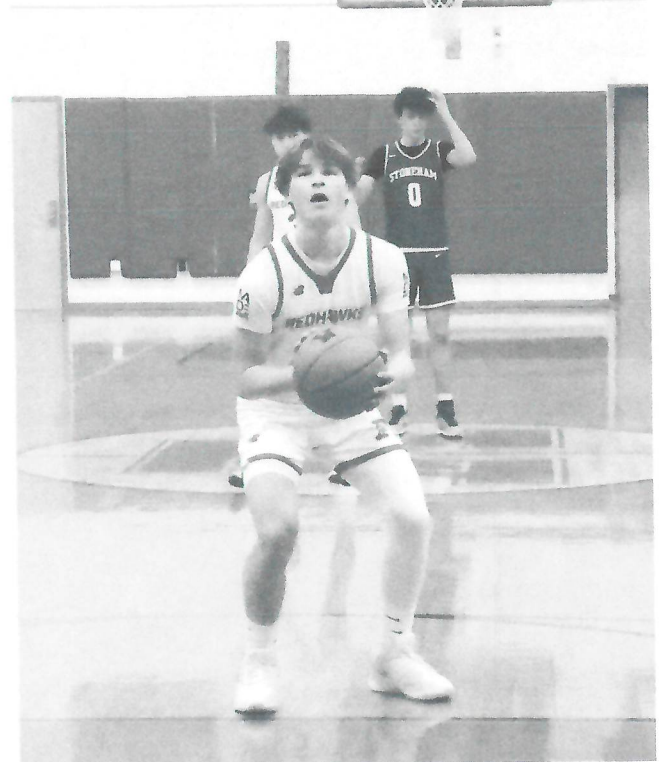
Parker DeLong was the highest scorer for Amesbury with 19 points. John Adams was second with 12. Justin Dube had 8.

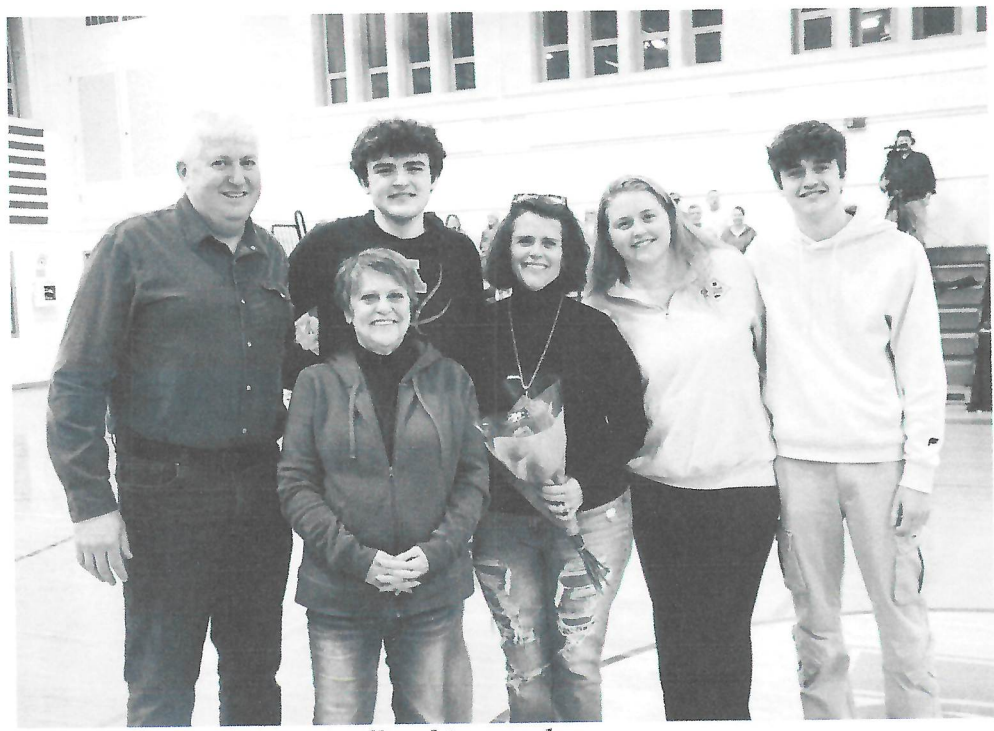

Girls' Basketball

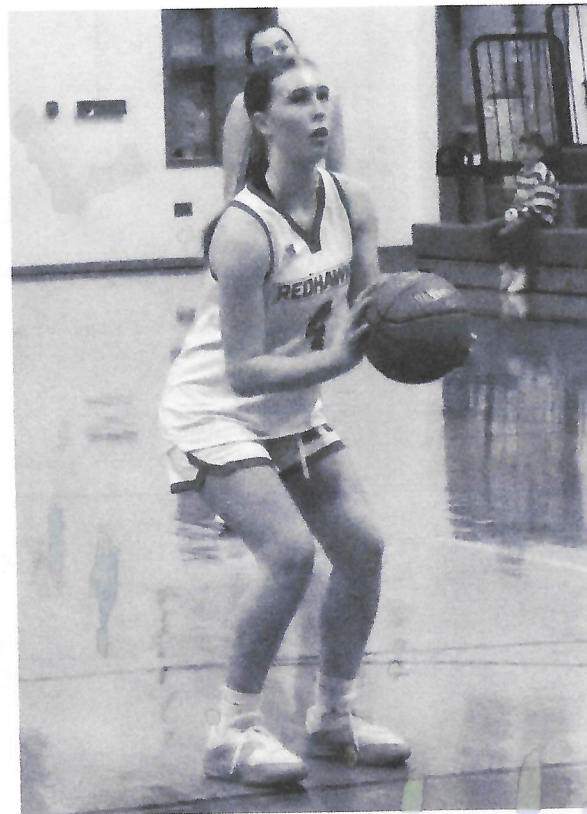
Although the girls basketball team lost their last three games of the regular season, they still made the tournament for the first time in three years with a record of 9-11.

The Manchester Essex game on February 13th was senior night. Ellie Martin and Sadie Bolth were honored. The Redhawks put up a good fight against Manchester before falling 49-53.

The top two scorers on the team are freshman Olivia McKay with 11.7 ppg and sophomore Ellison Talbot with 9.9 points per game.

Amesbury was the 26th seed in the tournament and unlike expectations, they actually got a home game to start against the 39th seed, the High School of Science and Technology in Springfield. Amesbury won the game 58-49, but for the most part, it wasn't that close. Except for a few minutes in the beginning, when the Cyberhawks scored a series of three pointers, Amesbury led all the way. It was 30-19 at the half. Senior captains Ellie Marden, who had a few of her classic three pointers, and the ever-aggressive Sadie Bolth seemed determined to make the most of their first opportunity ever to play states basketball. Bolth normally doesn't shoot much, but she had no hesitancy to put the ball up under the basket, fighting off three defenders in the process.

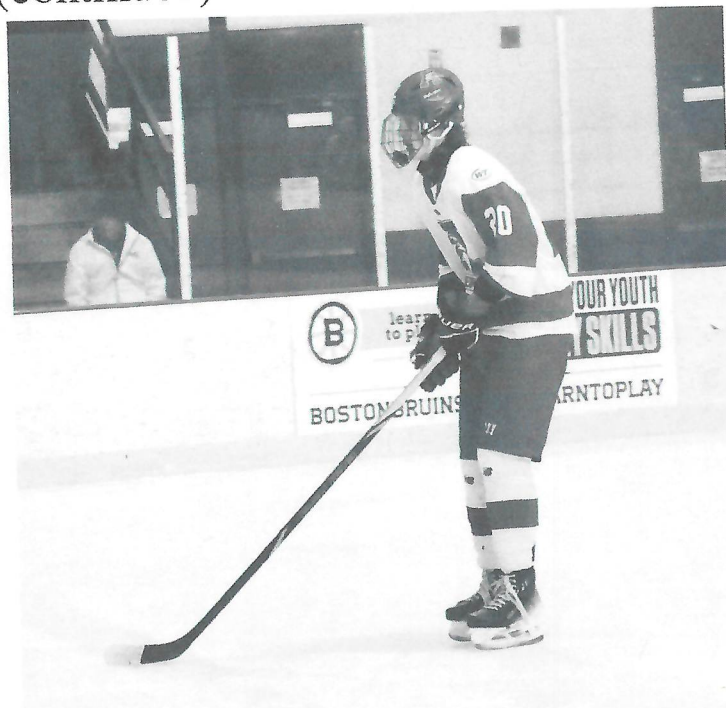
